COAL ACT, 1938, AND COAL INDUSTRY NATIONALISATION ACT, 1946.

PURSUANT to paragraph 6 (2) of the Second Schedule to the Coal Act, 1938, the National Coal Board hereby give notice that they propose to exercise the right to withdraw support vested in them by virtue of paragraph 6 (1) of the said Schedule and the Coal Industry Nationalisation Act, 1946, so far as the said right applies in relation to:—

(a) isolated parcels of land containing 328 acres or thereabouts situate in the Parishes of Ravenstone with Stribston and Coalville, lying generally in a North-South direction and extending from the vicinity of Sinope on the Ashby-de-la-Zouch—Coalville road in the North, skirting the East side of Ravenstone Village to the Coalville—Ibstock Parish boundary in the South;

(b) land containing 473 acres or thereabouts situate in the Parish of Ibstock, to the South East and North East of the Village of Ibstock and to the West of Whitehill Road, Whitehill;

NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949.

Rural District Council of Deben (Parish of Rendlesham No. 1) Diversion Order, 1958.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 2nd day of January, 1958, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Rendlesham.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way running from a point on the Eyke/Campsea Ashe Road approximately 93 yards north of Naunton Hall in a westerly direction through a stackyard and continuing for approximately 173 yards on the north side of the southern boundary of Ordnance Survey enclosure numbered 234 crossing the south-western corner of that enclosure into enclosure numbered 210 and continuing in a west-south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 13 yards terminating at this point to a line running from the termination of the existing path in a south-westerly direction following the eastern boundary of Ordnance Survey enclosure numbered 210 for a distance of approximately 227 yards turning in a south-south-westerly direction at the boundary between the Ordnance Survey enclosures numbered 210 and 206 for a distance of approximately 213 yards following the eastern boundaries of Ordnance Survey enclosures numbered 206 and 205 then turning due east through a gate which forms the division between Ordnance Survey enclosures numbered 205 and 219 and continuing for approximately 4 yards then turning in a south-south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 54 yards passing in front of two cottages known as Numbers 1 and 2, Church Lane, Rendlesham, and joining an existing right of way leading to St. Gregory's Church.
