## THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF IPSWICH (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (NO. 1) ORDER, 1958.

ON the 5th day of February, 1958, the Ipswich County Borough Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, to come into operation on the 1st day of August, 1958, the effect of which is that no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle—

(a) on St. George's Street between its junction with Hyde Park Corner and its junction with Bedford Street otherwise than in the direction south-west to north-east; and

(b) on Lady Lane between its junction with Hyde Park Corner and a point 268 feet 6 inches south-west of that junction otherwise than in the direction north-east to south-west.

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947.

## MIDDLESEX COUNTY COUNCIL.

*County of Middlesex Development Plan.*

NOTICE is hereby given that proposals for alterations or additions to the above Development Plan were on the 10th day of February, 1958, submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

The proposals relate to about 5.77 acres of land situate off High Road, Cowley, within the Borough of Uxbridge in the County of Middlesex, which land is bounded by the railway on the South and the Grand Union Canal on the West.

Certified copies of the proposals as submitted have been deposited for public inspection at the Council Offices, 265, High Street, Uxbridge, and also in the County Planning Department, No. 10, Great George Street, Westminster, S.W.1.

The copies of the proposals so deposited together with copies or relevant extracts of the Development Plan are available for inspection free of charge by all persons interested at the places mentioned above between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and 9.30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays (except in the case of the copy deposited in the County Planning Department which will not be open for inspection on Saturdays).

Any objection or representation with reference to the proposals may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 8th day of April, 1958 and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made. Persons making an objection or representation may register their names and addresses with the Clerk of the Middlesex County Council, Guildhall, Westminster, S.W.1, and will then be entitled to receive notice of any amendment of the Development Plan made as a result of the proposals.

## GLOUCESTER RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL (SCHOOL PLAYING FIELD—BROCKWORTH) EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER, 1957.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 31st day of January, 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish the undermentioned public right of way over land owned by Gloucestershire County Council.

Footpath of undefined width over O.S. 202 and 217 from a point in Moorfield Road near Brockworth County School No. 2015 (marked "A" on map) for a distance of 960 feet in a general North-Easterly direction to a point (marked "B" on map) on the boundary of the School playing field where it formerly crossed O.S. 217, marked A-B and coloured brown as indicated in map.

The old right of way will be closed as from the 1st day of March, 1958.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order, as confirmed by the Minister, has been deposited at the offices of the Council, 29, Brunswick Square, Gloucester, and will be open for inspection free of charge during the usual office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 11th day of February, 1958, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

## MELFORD RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*(Stoke Priory) No. 2 Diversion Order, 1957.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 30th day of January, 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert as from the 13th February, 1958, the section of the public right of way running from Mill Lane, Polstead, in a westerly direction to Elm Pollard, Stoke-by-Nayland, and thence to a point approximately 175 yards south-west of Elm Pollard, to a line running from that point in Mill Lane in a straight line to a point approximately 175 yards south-west of Elm Pollard.
