WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of January, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Exchange of Patronage) Act, 1853, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1860, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of certain interests in the patronage of certain benefices in the diocese of Oxford, namely, the exchange of (i) the alternate right of patronage of the benefice of Oving with Pitchcott and (ii) the alternate right of patronage of the benefice of Saint Michael, Walton, both of which said interests are now vested in Your Majesty and exercisable on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being, for the patronage of the benefice of Wotton Underwood with Ashendon, now vested in the Archdeacon of Buckingham in right of his Archdeaconry,

and we do hereby certify that we have made due enquiry into the respective circumstances and present values of the said benefices and that they are as set forth in the Schedule to the said Scheme.

"SCHEME.

"With the consent of the Right Honourable David Patrick Maxwell, Viscount Kilmuir, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and with the consent of the Venerable Gordon David Savage, now Archdeacon of Buckingham, (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), the alternate rights of patronage of and presentation to the said benefices of Oving with Pitchcott and Saint Michael, Walton, now vested in Your Majesty, shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the said Gordon David Savage, as Archdeacon of Buckingham, and his successors in the same Archdeaconry, and in exchange for the same the patronage of the said benefice of Wotton Underwood with Ashendon, now vested in the said Gordon David Savage, Archdeacon of Buckingham, shall be transferred to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and be exercisable on behalf of Your Majesty by the said Viscount Kilmuir or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 31st day of January, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of North Baddesley, Rownhams and Chilworth, all in the diocese of Winchester.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Winchester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of North Baddesley, Rownhams and Chilworth shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of North Baddesley:—

"All those contiguous parts (together coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Rownhams and Chilworth which are bounded on part of the west and on the north by the parish of North Baddesley and on the remaining sides by a continuous imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parishes of North Baddesley and Chilworth at the northern end of the eastern boundary of close numbered 10 on the map and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned boundary to its end and thence generally southwestwards along
