MORE SYNTHETIC ORGANIC CHEMICALS LIABLE TO K.I.D.

The Board of Trade have made the Safeguarding of Industries (Supplementary List of Synthetic Organic Chemicals, etc.) Order, 1958, which issues a supplementary list of sixty-six chemicals liable to Key Industry Duty.

The supplementary list (List J) is as follows:—

Synthetic organic chemicals (other than synthetic organic dyestuffs, colours, and colouring matters imported for use as such and organic intermediate products imported for their manufacture), analytical re-agents, all other fine chemicals (except sulphate of quinine of vegetable origin) and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes, the following:—

WAGES COUNCILS ACTS, 1945 TO 1948.

PIN, HOOK AND EYE, AND SNAP FASTENER WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) amending the Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages (Regulation Order, 1952 (Order O. (47)) as amended by the Wages Regulation (Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener) (Amendment) Order, 1957 (Order O. (58)) and (2) the revocation of Orders O. (47) and O. (58).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 28th February, 1958. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener Wages Council (Great Britain), Ebury Bridge House, Ebury Bridge Road, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.
