The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation in accordance with the London Traffic Aot, 1924, sec-tion 10, as amended, proposes to refer to the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee for their advice and report a proposal that he should make Paculations :--make Regulations :-

(A) to restrict waiting by vehicles between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in :-

1. Bartholomew Lane, from its junction with Throgmorton Street to a point 60 feet north of its junction with Threadneedle Street. 2. Basinghall Street, from its junction with Gresham Street northward for a distance of 45

feet.

Cloak Lane, from its junction with Queen Street eastward for a distance of 45 feet.
 Coleman Street, from its junction with Loth-bury northward for a distance of 45 feet.
 Gresham Street, between its junction with Milk Street and the acet side of its junction with

Milk Street and the east side of its junction with Coleman Street.

Coleman Street. 6. King Street, from its junction with Gresham Street to a point 120 feet north of its junction with Cheapside. 7. Lothbury, from a point 120 feet east of its junction with Moorgate to the east side of its junction with Bartholomew Lane. 8. Old Jewry, (a) the west side, from its junction with Gresham Street southward for a distance of 45 feet.

(b) on both sides, from its junction with Fredericks Place southward for a distance of 24 feet.

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9. Queen Street, from its junction with Upper Thames Street to a point 120 feet south of its junction with Cannon Street.
10. Throgmorton Street, between its junction with Bartholomew Lane and its junction with Brand Street

11. Trump Street, from its junction with King Street westward for a distance of 45 feet.
12. Upper Thames Street, from the east side of its junction with Brickhill Lane to a point 110 feet west of the western side of its junction with Queen Street.
(Exemptions will be provided in the Regulations to permit vehicles to wait—fo pick up and set down passengers, to load and unload goods, to carry out essential services, or while in use by local authorities in an emergency.)
(B) to prohibit waiting by vehicles between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive on the east side of Old Jewry, between its junction with Fredericks Place.
(Exemptions will be provided in the Regulations)

(Exemptions will be provided in the Regulations (Exemptions will be provided in the regulations to permit vehicles to wait—to pick up and set down passengers, to carry out essential services, or while in use by local authorities in an emergency.) s.

The above restrictions are at present in operation on an experimental basis.

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS, 1877 TO 1927. Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agri-culture, Fisheries and Food has made an Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Aots, 1877 to 1927, entified the Wart Disease of Potatoes Order, 1958, which supersedes the Wart Disease of Potatoes Order, of 10^{41} of 1941.

which supersedes the Wart Disease of Potatoes Order, of 1941. The 1941 Order restricted the planting and sale for planting of potatoes in the traditional potato-growing areas in the Eastern Counties (known as the "Pro-tected Area") to stocks granted a certificate under one of the Schemes for the inspection and certifica-tion of growing crops of potatoes administered by the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Agricultural Departments of Scotland, Northern Ireland, the Isle of Man and the Republic of Ireland. Because of the continued shortage of certified seed, this restriction was in practice modified by annual General Licence Orders which allowed the planting or sale for planting within the Protected Area of potatoes grown in that area and which are of the class "uncertified (English once-grown)." A General Licence Order also allowed the planting and sale of any potatoes (other than foreign-grown) although not certified. The new Order makes these modifications per-manent and also permits the planting in the Pro-tected Area of potatoes certified by one of the Agricultural Departments to have been grown on land in which Wart Disease is not known to have occurred.
