The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of February, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Exchange of Patronage) Act, 1853, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1860, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice of Croxby with Thoresway, of a one third interest of the patronage of the benefice of Hameringham with Scrafield and Winceby and of the alternate right of the patronage of the benefice of Edlington with Wispington (which said interests are now vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being) for a two thirds interest of the patronage of the benefice of Blyton with Pilham and the alternate right of the patronage of the benefice of Hatton with Sotby (which said interests are now vested in the Board of Patronage of the diocese of Lincoln), all of which said benefices are situated in

the diocese of Lincoln and we do hereby certify that we have made due inquiry into the respective circumstances and present values of the said benefices and that they are as set forth in the Schedule to the said Scheme

"SCHEME.

"With the consent of the Right Honourable David Patrick Maxwell, Viscount Kilmuir, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and of the Board of Patronage of the diocese of Lincoln (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme) the said right of patronage and presentation to the said benefice of Croxby with Thoresway, the said one third interest in the right of patronage and presentation to the said benefice of Hameringham with Scrafield and Winceby and the said alternate right of patronage and presentation to the said benefice of Edlington with Wispington shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the Board of Patronage of the diocese of Lincoln and in exchange for the same the said two thirds interest in the right of patronage and presentation to the said benefice of Blyton with Pilham and the said alternate right of patronage and presentation to the said benefice of Hatton with Sotby shall be transferred to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and be exercisable by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being on behalf of Your Majesty.
