WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of March, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Paul, Blackley, and Saint Peter, Blackley, both in the diocese of Manchester.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

“Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Paul, Blackley, and Saint Peter, Blackley, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

“THE SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Paul, Blackley:—

“All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Peter, Blackley, which is bounded on the northwest by the parish of Saint Paul, Blackley, on the northeast by the parish of Tonge-cum-Alkrington and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the Parish of Tonge-cum-Alkrington from the parish of Saint Peter, Blackley, in the middle of the footpath leading from Victoria Avenue East (adjacent to the house and premises known as Number 119, Victoria Avenue East) to Moss Lane and proceeding thence first southwards then southeastwards then southwards along the middle of the said footpath to its end at Victoria Avenue East and continuing thence first southwards to then northwestwards along the middle of Victoria Avenue East to a point opposite the northern end of the wall or fence which forms the eastern boundary of Crosslee Primary School and continuing thence southwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end at the northern side of the un-named road or lane leading from the northeastern

end of White Moss Road to Victoria Avenue East and continuing thence first southwards to and then southwestwards along the middle of the said un-named road or lane to its junction with the northeastern end of White Moss Road and continuing thence in a straight line southwestwards to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 65, White Moss Road and continuing thence first southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundaries of the houses and premises known as Number 67, White Moss Road and 5 and 7 Newburn Avenue then generally westwards along the wall or fence forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Number 67 White Moss Road and 5 and 7 Newburn Avenue then generally westwards along the wall or fence forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Numbers 7, 9, 10, 8 and 6 Newburn Avenue to its junction with the southern end of the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises known as Numbers 7, 5, 3 and 1 Pembridge Road from the houses and premises known as Numbers 6 and 4 Newburn Avenue and Numbers 77 and 79 White Moss Road and continuing thence generally northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence in a straight line southwestwards across Pembridge Road to the northeastern end of the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises known as Numbers 81, 83 and 85 White Moss Road from the houses and premises known as Numbers 2 and 4 Pembridge Road and continuing thence generally southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Numbers 85 to 111 White Moss Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 111 White Moss Road and continuing thence northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of White Moss Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of White Moss Road to its junction with the northeastern end of the un-named track or footpath leading from Rochdale Road to White Moss Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned track or footpath for a distance of 12½ chains and continuing thence northwestwards in a straight line to the middle of the southwestern end of Elmton Road (thereby crossing close numbered 2141) and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Elmton Road to a point opposite the southeastern end of the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundaries of the houses and premises known as Numbers 4 and 2 Elmton Road and Numbers 10 and 8 Levedale Road continuing thence northwestwards to and along the last mentioned wall

or fence to its junction with the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises known as Numbers 312, 314, 316 and 318 Rochdale Road from the houses and premises known as Numbers 6, 4 and 2 Levedale Road and continuing thence first north-eastwards then north-westwards then north-eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 2 Levedale Road and continuing thence north-eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Levedale Road and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of Levedale Road to its junction with Rochdale Road and continuing thence first north-westwards to and then north-eastwards along the middle of Rochdale Road to a point opposite the middle of the eastern end of Hilldale Avenue and continuing thence north-westwards to then first north-westwards then westwards along the middle of Hilldale Avenue to its junction with Hill Lane and continuing thence in a straight line westwards to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 147 Hill Lane and continuing thence south-westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point on the wall or fence forming the rear boundary of the house and premises known as Number 15 Strain Avenue and continuing thence south-westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence first generally south-westwards then generally north-westwards then generally northwards along the wall or fence forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Numbers 15 to 19 (odd), 20 to 2 (even) Strain Avenue to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Peter, Blackley, from the parish of Saint Paul, Blackley."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of March, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Ronald, Bishop of Leicester, (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Gilmorton and the benefice of Peatling Parva, both situate in the diocese of Leicester.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Gilmorton and the benefice of Peatling Parva shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Gilmorton with Peatling Parva' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Charles

Grayburn Richardson if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Gilmorton shall, with his consent, (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Without prejudice to the exercise before the date when the union takes effect of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage houses at present belonging to the benefices of Gilmorton and Peatling Parva, if at that date they so belong, and the site and appurtenances thereof shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and so much of the net proceeds of such sales as we, after consultation with the Bishop of the diocese, shall approve shall be applied towards the cost of providing a new parsonage house at Gilmorton for the united benefice and the balance, if any, of such net proceeds shall be held by us on behalf of the united benefice as endowment capital subject to the provisions of the Benefices (Stabilisation of Incomes) Measure, 1951.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Gilmorton having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the Archdeaconry of Loughborough and the rural deanery of Guthlaxton II."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Great Cheverell and part of the united benefice of West, or Bishop's, Lavington with Little Cheverell, both situate in the diocese of Salisbury.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* That part of the united benefice of West, or Bishop's, Lavington with Little Cheverell which coincides with the area of the parish of Little Cheverell shall be severed from the said united benefice and the part so severed and the benefice of Great Cheverell shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Great Cheverell and Little Cheverell' but the parishes of Great Cheverell and Little Cheverell shall continue in all respects distinct; and the remaining part of the united benefice of West, or Bishop's, Lavington with Little Cheverell shall be known as 'The Benefice of Bishop's Lavington' and the incumbent thereof shall have the cure of souls within the limits of the parish of Bishop's Lavington.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the united benefice of West, or Bishop's, Lavington with

Little Cheverell shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect but if it shall then be full the union shall, with the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Percival Sexty now incumbent of the benefice of Great Cheverell as well as of the said united benefice, take effect immediately upon the next avoidance of the said united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage house.* Upon the union taking effect the glebe house at present belonging to the benefice of Great Cheverell shall, if at that date it so belongs, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice of Great Cheverell and Little Cheverell.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice of Great Cheverell and Little Cheverell shall be exercised alternately by the patron of the present united benefice of West, or Bishop's, Lavington with Little Cheverell and by the patron of the present benefice of Great Cheverell, the first mentioned patron having the first presentation to the united benefice of Great Cheverell and Little Cheverell to be made after the union and the right of presentation or nomination to the separate benefice of Bishop's Lavington shall belong to and be exercised solely by the patron of the present united benefice of West, or Bishop's, Lavington with Little Cheverell.

"5. *Endowments and property.* Upon the union taking effect the endowments and property now belonging to the united benefice of West, or Bishop's, Lavington with Little Cheverell shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £298, being part of a larger capital sum held by us for the said united benefice, shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Great Cheverell and Little Cheverell and all other the endowments and property (including the parsonage house) of the united benefice of West, or Bishop's, Lavington with Little Cheverell shall be assigned and annexed to the separate benefice of Bishop's Lavington."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices (Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Schedule has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Exchange of Patronage) Act, 1853, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1860, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of certain interests in the patronage of certain benefices in the diocese of Worcester, namely, the exchange of (i) the alternate right of patronage of the benefice of Elmbridge with Rushock and (ii) the one third interest in the patronage of the benefice of Earl's Croome with Hill Croome and Strensham, which said interests are now vested in Your Majesty and exercisable on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being, for (i) the alternate right of patronage of the benefice of Stoke Bliss with Kyre and (ii) the alternate right of patronage of the benefice of Upton Snodsbury with Broughton Hackett, which said interests are now vested in the

Bishop of Worcester in right of his See, and we do hereby certify that we have made due enquiry into the respective circumstances and present values of the said benefices and that they are as set forth in the Schedule to the said Scheme.

"SCHEME.

"With the consent of the Right Honourable David Patrick Maxwell, Viscount Kilmuir, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Worcester, (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), the alternate right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Elmbridge with Rushock, now vested in Your Majesty, and the one third interest of Your Majesty in the patronage of the said benefice of Earl's Croome with Hill Croome and Strensham shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the said Mervyn, as Bishop of Worcester, and his successors in the same See, and in exchange for the same the alternate rights of patronage of and presentation to the said benefices of Stoke Bliss with Kyre and Upton Snodsbury with Broughton Hackett, now vested in the said Mervyn, as Bishop of Worcester, shall be transferred to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and be exercisable on behalf of Your Majesty by the said Viscount Kilmuir or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

DAINGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1951.

SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(Alex Forbath.)

Whereas Alex Forbath, M.D., Budapest, Ph.D. Vienna, whose registered address is 38, New Road, Abbey Wood, London, S.E.2, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts 1920 to 1932:

And whereas the authorities respectively conferred by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the Raw Opium etc., Regulations, 1937, on the said Alex Forbath by virtue of his being a duly qualified medical practitioner, to be in possession of and to supply the drugs and preparations to which these Regulations applied were withdrawn in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 7 of the first mentioned Regulations and Regulation 5 of the last mentioned Regulations by Notice published in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette on the 8th February, 1946:

And whereas by the said Notice it was directed that it should not be lawful for the said Alex Forbath

to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1937:

And whereas the operation of the said Notice was by Notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 9th December, 1947, suspended until further Order:

And whereas the operation of the said Notice of Suspension was, by Notice published in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette on the 10th February, 1953, cancelled:

And whereas the aforesaid Regulations have been revoked by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, and by virtue of Regulation 38 thereof the aforesaid withdrawal, direction, suspension and cancellation are deemed to have been done and given under the said Regulations of 1953:

And whereas I am satisfied that it is expedient to suspend the said withdrawal of authorities from the said Alex Forbath:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 29 and 38 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, I hereby suspend the said withdrawal of authorities from the said Alex Forbath and I further suspend the operation of the aforesaid direction regarding prescriptions given in respect of the said Alex Forbath.

REGULATIONS FOR RECRUITMENT TO THE STATISTICIAN CLASS.

1. Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

2. *Age.*

Candidates must be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on the 1st August, 1958.

But (a) a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces or in H.M. Overseas Civil Service may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before the 1st August, 1958;

(b) a candidate who has post-graduate statistical experience approved by the Commissioners may deduct from his actual age the period of such experience gained before the 1st August, 1958, up to a maximum of three years.

3. *Nationality.*

To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth:—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

4. *Qualifications.*

Candidates may be mathematical or economic statisticians. They must have a higher degree in statistics, or a post-graduate University diploma in statistics, or a University degree with first or second class honours (upper second where the second class is divided) of which statistics formed the main part, or in which at least two statistics papers were taken in the final examination. Those so qualifying this summer will be eligible.

5. *Selection.*

A short-list will be made of candidates who appear to be best qualified. Preference may be given to those who have some post-graduate statistical experience as well as good academic qualifications. If a candidate has not taken statistics as the principal subject of his degree he will not be on the short list unless his work in the statistics papers which he has taken reached good second class honours standard.

Candidates on the short list will be invited to an informal preliminary interview, and to an interview before a Final Selection Board which will recom-

mend to the Civil Service Commissioners those considered most suitable for appointment.

6. *Health and Character.*

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

7. *Candidates trained as Teachers.*

Candidates who have been trained as teachers in Northern Ireland or in the Irish Republic, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Commissioners.

8. *Canvassing.*

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

9. *Fee.*

Every successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £4 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

1. Men only are eligible.

2. There are no age limits, but Departments expect regular and effective service for a reasonable period, and this requirement will be taken into account.

3. A candidate will not be eligible for appointment unless (i) at all times since his birth he has been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and (ii) he was born in a country or territory which is (or then was) within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic and (iii) each of his parents was born in a country or territory which is (or then was) within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic and is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times from birth:

Provided that, notwithstanding that the aforesaid conditions are not satisfied, he may be admitted to appointment by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty if he is a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfies one of the following conditions:—

(a) If he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth:—

4. Candidates must be (a) experienced and fully-skilled in their particular trade, craft or subject, (b) able to teach their trade, craft or subject, and (c) able to supervise the work, and maintain control, of trainees engaged in their trade, craft or subject.

Candidates should have undergone the training usual in their particular trade, craft or subject, followed by practical experience on fully-skilled work for a reasonable number of years (normally not less than five years in a craft trade). These provisions may be waived only exceptionally for individual candidates whose training in the trade, craft or subject and practical experience are comparable with the qualifications normally required. It is desirable for candidates for posts in Grade III to be in possession of an Ordinary National Certificate or City and Guilds Certificate or equivalent qualifications in the appropriate subject, where such qualifications exist.

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

4. Qualifications and experience.
