At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 14th day of *March*, 1958.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of March, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Paul, Blackley, and Saint Peter, Blackley, both in the diocese of Manchester.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

“Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Paul, Blackley, and Saint Peter, Blackley, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

“THE SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Paul, Blackley:—

“All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Peter, Blackley, which is bounded on the northwest by the parish of Saint Paul, Blackley, on the northeast by the parish of Tonge-cum-Alkrington and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the Parish of Tonge-cum-Alkrington from the parish of Saint Peter, Blackley, in the middle of the footpath leading from Victoria Avenue East (adjacent to the house and premises known as Number 119, Victoria Avenue East) to Moss Lane and proceeding thence first southwards then southeastwards then southwards along the middle of the said footpath to its end at Victoria Avenue East and continuing thence first southwards to then northwestwards along the middle of Victoria Avenue East to a point opposite the northern end of the wall or fence which forms the eastern boundary of Crosslee Primary School and continuing thence southwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end at the northern side of the un-named road or lane leading from the northeastern

end of White Moss Road to Victoria Avenue East and continuing thence first southwards to and then southwestwards along the middle of the said un-named road or lane to its junction with the northeastern end of White Moss Road and continuing thence in a straight line southwestwards to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 65, White Moss Road and continuing thence first southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundaries of the houses and premises known as Number 67, White Moss Road and 5 and 7 Newburn Avenue then generally westwards along the wall or fence forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Number 67 White Moss Road and 5 and 7 Newburn Avenue then generally westwards along the wall or fence forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Numbers 7, 9, 10, 8 and 6 Newburn Avenue to its junction with the southern end of the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises known as Numbers 7, 5, 3 and 1 Pembridge Road from the houses and premises known as Numbers 6 and 4 Newburn Avenue and Numbers 77 and 79 White Moss Road and continuing thence generally northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence in a straight line southwestwards across Pembridge Road to the northeastern end of the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises known as Numbers 81, 83 and 85 White Moss Road from the houses and premises known as Numbers 2 and 4 Pembridge Road and continuing thence generally southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the rear boundaries of the houses and premises known as Numbers 85 to 111 White Moss Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 111 White Moss Road and continuing thence northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of White Moss Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of White Moss Road to its junction with the northeastern end of the un-named track or footpath leading from Rochdale Road to White Moss Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned track or footpath for a distance of 12½ chains and continuing thence northwestwards in a straight line to the middle of the southwestern end of Elmton Road (thereby crossing close numbered 2141) and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Elmton Road to a point opposite the southeastern end of the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundaries of the houses and premises known as Numbers 4 and 2 Elmton Road and Numbers 10 and 8 Levedale Road continuing thence northwestwards to and along the last mentioned wall
