PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of May, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint John, Bury and Christ Church, Walmersley, both in the diocese of Manchester.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint John, Bury and Christ Church, Walmersley, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint John, Bury:

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Christ Church, Walmersley, which is bounded on the west and south by the parish of Saint John, Bury, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Bury, from the parish of Christ Church, Walmersley, opposite the middle of the southern end of Back Walmersley Road and proceeding thence northwards to and along the middle of Back Walmersley Road to a point in the middle of Wolstenholme Avenue and continuing thence westwards along the middle of Wolstenholme Avenue to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the unnamed footpath leading from Littlewood Farm to How Lane and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of the said footpath to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Pigs Lee Brook and continuing thence generally south-westwards along the middle of Pigs Lee Brook and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the River Irwell on the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Walmersley, from the parish of Saint John, Bury."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of May, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund, Bishop of Truro (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the parish of Forrabury and the parish of Minster, being two of the parishes of the united benefice of Forrabury and Minster with Trevalga, situate in the diocese of Truro.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Parishes.*

"Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the parish of Forrabury and the parish of Minster shall, with the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Robert George Lynton Beazeley being the incumbent of the united benefice of Forrabury and Minster with Trevalga be permanently united together and form one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Parish of Forrabury and Minster', but the parish of Trevalga shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Parish Church.*

"The parish church of the parish of Forrabury shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"3. *Registers.*

"The marriage registers at the church of Minster shall be dealt with by the incumbent of the united benefice in accordance with the provisions of Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of Forrabury."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas, we, the Church Commissioners are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment thereof will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as the church of Saint John the Baptist, Carlton, which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Bishop of Southwell by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 30th January, 1958, and made pursuant to Section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943:
