Pendennis, Octob. 25.

Ere are lately put in feveral French fhips with Salt; one Veffel from the Streights, and one, from Portugal bound for Dartmouth laden with Oy's t this laft week was cast away at the Ligard a Danish fhip laden with Deals, 17 of her men faved and two loft with the veffel.

Falmouth, Offsb. 27. Several thips lately arrived here from Burdeaux inform us, that divers Dutch thips which were there intending to load Wines, returned empty upon' the advice of a great impolition laid upon French Wines in Holland.

Madrid, Offab. 1. The Baron de Rede, Ambaffador from the State-General of the United Provinces having before his death difcovered himfelf to be a profetfor of the Roman Catholick Religion, The Queen has been pleafed to give ordet for the furnithing a Bed of State with large filver Candleflicks and the furnine of 4000 Crowns to defray the expences of his Funeral which was folemized in the Jeluits Colledge with much Ceremony, where attended perfons of the greateft Eminency about the Town, and Her Majeflies Guards, to whom were lately added 300 Spanish Foot lately arrived from Cordous and Seville.

The Marquis de Liche who was defigned to have been fent Ambalfadot to Portugal, has defired to be excused from that emploiment which would be much prejudicial to his other affairs and concernments here.

This Court being now affured of the truth of the Report of the furrender of *Candia*, has fent Orders to the Viceroy of *Naples* and *Sicily* to take care for the Well fottifying of all their Sea-ports and Landing places, to prevent any attempts the Turks may hereafter have of coming on thoar within those territories.

on thoar within those territories. Legorn, Octob. 21. Yesterday arrived here a Batk in 24. Hours bringing over 14 Horles and 3 Coaches which had been presented to the Prince of Tuscany in France, by this vessel we are informed that the Prince embarked and departed from the same place the 18th instant, so that we bourly expect his arrival here.

Cracovia, Oftob. 15. On Saturday laft the Vice-Chancellout of this Kingdom made a Speech at the Diet in prefence of His Majeliy, enlarging himself much upon the danget threatened from the Turks, and exhorting the Asfembly to rake fome speedy and timely care to' prevent the milchiefs which other wile may fpring from this too near neighbourhood and conjunction with the Collacks; which done, the Archbithop of Guefne made an elegant speech upon the lame fubject, representing and laying open the necessities of the publick and the present ill state of affairs, flowing how much they were concerned to make a timely application to the neighbour Christian. Princes, to joyn their affistances for their common interest against the Common Enemy, exhoring all perfons of the Kingdom to courribute what they are able for the payment and encourage-ment of their Army, to whom he intended by his volunrary Contribution to give a good example ; but adding, that if he found the Generality inclined to confult rather their private pations and interests then that of the publick, he knew as well as any how to retire himfelf out of the Kingdom that he might not be an Eye-witnels of the lucceeling evils, but this difcourfe, how pathetick loever, had not the effects which his zeal expected from the Allembly, for the next day the Noblefs refused to discusse any publick

e affair till they had first fatisfaction given them in three particulars.

1. That the Deputies from the feveral Provinces might be better and more conveniently lodged, without expense as in former Diets, and that they be reimpurfed in the Moneys laid out by them on that account.

2. That about 18 of the Deputies who have judgements of Infamy against them, thay be refused the liberty of their Votes till they have first purged themselves.

3. That fince a former Law was made for the Sequefication of all vacant Governments for the recompening of fuch of the Nobleffe as had loft their Eftates by the late troubles in Ukrania, they defired that an Infection might be made into thiat affair, and the Revenues arifing from the faid vacaheies disposed of according to the true intension of the faid Law, all which points tis feared may octahion many heats to the differentiation of the Diet.

From Ukrania we have confirmation on all hands of the Conjunction of the Turks and Coffacks, and that the Turks have befides the Town of Rafehow, fortified allo Scarrogrost hearer to Camitanity, both of these places formerly belonging to this Kings Father. This week has been spent in Treats and Divertisements, the great perfons in their Order Feasting His Majesty with extraordinary Magpificence.

On Sundaylaft the Count d' Harath under the Charatter of Ambaliador from His Catholick Majefty, prefented the King with the Order of the Golden Fleece; the Ceremony performed in the Kings Chamber, and the Wedneiday following returned for Vienna; 'Iis generally believed the Kings Marriage with the Emperours Sifter will luddenly follow, although a propolat his been lately made of a Daugher of the late Dike d' Offrock, whole Mother is now wife to Dake Michael Radzivil.

Segnior Potoski the under Sewer 10 the Crown, who during the last Diet at the Election, was cholen Marchul or Speaker of the Nobleis, is now preferred to the Charge of Palacine of Sirddla, and his Brother in-law Prince Lubomirsky succeeds in his vacancy.

The Evening of the great Fealt at the Coronation happened a quartel at the houle of the Grand Marefhal, between Duke Demetrius Wilniewisky, General of the Army, and neerly related to the King, and the Palatine of Rulsia, between whom patted a challenge to the Field, fiv which they were prevented by the interpopolal of leveral petfors of Honour, but two of their principal Gentlemen meeting, clolely diffuted, their Mafters quartel, till one of them had his left Arm cut off with one blow of a Schable or Polifit (word.

The Court continues their refolution of fending another Minister to Madrid in the room of the Conde de Miranda, but as yet no nomination is made.

Abour 4 days finc., the Conie de Pontevora with his Brother, were fent prisoners to the Castle of Setubil for abusing an Officer of the Court fent to t'e house of the latter in fearch of a Malefactor which was faid to have retired thither. Genoua, Ottob. 16. On Thursday las went hence offe of the Galacsof this Republick for Savona, being Ordered to waite the Commands of Cardinal Antonio, and attend him in his Voyage for Rome, and is fince pathed by in view of this Port, bound for Civita Vetchia.

The 9th inflant returned-hither two Gallies of this place, having for fome time been Crufing about the Island of carfica, and have brought home with them the Imall Turkish Prize which they leized in those Sess.

Two of the Ships which are fold by Segnior Hippolito Conturione to His Most Christian Majesty, are now in this Port to furnish themselves with Meny and to take in Canon, and in few dayes may put again to See, intending for Thoton.

The Differences between this Republick and the Pope about the Inquifitor, are in a fair way of Accommodation, which, when fully ended, 'tis faid the Pope defignes hither a fquadron of his Galliss to conduct to Rome Segi for Steffano Pallavicinos Daughter, the Mach being now fully concluded between her and the Popes Neple, who is to have with her the fum of about 200 thousand Piffole, with which he intends to purchafe the Principality of Piembino.

This last week Segnior Hippolito Conturione, having intelligence, that the Ship Commanded by Captain Lanare of this place, to which he pretended a half-share, had put into Legorne, hoping by that means to elease from him, prefently Arm'd out 2 Chal ups in her Pursuite's who overtaking her in the Rood of Legorne, feized her, not with flanding fover. I show made at them from the Fort, which killed fome of theil Scamep, and hurt divers others. He intended to have be ought in, hister his Prize, but, finding fome opposition among it cut Superiors, thought fit to fend her away to Wills Francha.

Ipon Information brought to our Superiors by an Exprefs, that the Dyke of Savore's Officer in the Valley of Oneglia, "had Imprifoned Seguior Caraqqa Commander of the Forces fent by this Republick to lie upon the Frontiers. They have Ordered two of their Gallies to depart hence with feveral Companies of Foot to Brengthen our Fo ces on that fide, till the Republick fhall be better informed qf the whole Matter...

the whole Matter. From *M lin*, they Write, That they have forme-hopes that the Di putes ariign between the Pope and the Spanish Governor of that Dutchy, about the Revenues of the supprefied Convents may admit of a Friend'y Compofure.

The Governor is taking Order about the Affignation of Quatters to the fo ldiers, intending fo to Order Affairs, that in cafe it shall be thought fit to encrease the number of them, the People may not be put to any unnecessary charges or trouble.

Vienna, Octob. 20. Since the peace lately concluded between the Venetians and the Tunks, our approbations are entreafed, left the Ottoman force may feck a new employment by giving us a diffurbance in Hungary, elpecially fit te they prefs us hard for the difmaniling the Fort neet Gomerre, and make feveral other demands which His Inperial Majefty cannot in Honour comply with s but that we may not be found altogther difabled from making our defence if the Turks thould make any attempts, upon us, great care is taken for the repairing all our fortifications of the form whence he issues of the fourtiers of the special continues at Raab, from whence he issues out his Orders for the fupply of the Magazines, and furnithing the feveral Garrifons with flores of all forts, in fluch manner as may be least fenfible and burdehome to the Inhabitants of these parts, which providence of his has much obliged the people, and confirmed them in their obedience to his Imperial Majefty.

The Emperour having notice that the Turks were difpatching hither an Aga with farther complaints and demands, has given Order to the Count de Montecuculi to ftop him in his way birber and to return him with fuch anfiver as he shall be furnished with by the instructions which shall be feat him for that purpole, and if the Aga were alfeady pass him and upon his way hither; then to fend after him, and to conduct him to the City of Raab.

The Bishop of Munfier has lately sent hither an Heclesiastical perion his Envoye, to impart (as he pretends) leveral thi gs of great and weighty importance to His Imperial Majesty, but (as is believed) to endeavour to divert the Emperour from entring into the Lesgue with the Frinces of Germany, for lecuring the peace between the two Crowns of France and Spain.

Cologne, Oflob. 2.9. 'Tis confidently faid that an Alliance is now Treated of between the King of Donmark and the Prince Elector Palatine, which is to be semented by a Marriage between Prince Charles, the cldeft Son of the Prince Elector, and His faid Majeftys youngeft Daughter,

From Majene: we are told that the Elector has been fome time at M'ittsbourg in Franconia, and has given Order for the blowing up and rafing of his Caffle of Starkenbourg neer Bergfrafs, and that there has been lately a meeting at Mulhaufen in Thuring, of the Deputies from is Electoral Highne's of Mayence, the Princes of Lunenburg and Brunfmick, the Landgrave of Heffen Caffel and the Bilhop of Muniter, for the composure of some private disputs.

And from Ratisbonne, that the agreement made for the Regulation of Moneys, is fully ended and concluded with the approbation of His Imperial Majefty, to that that Affembly is now wholly intent upon the other affair of greater concerament for the fecurity of the Empire, in which theyhave agreed upon the number of forces to be railed both of Horie and Foor, and are now upon the choice of fat Officers to Command them, to whom they intend speedily to iffue out Commissions that they may proceed to raile, their men, as allo of paymasiters for the Army, and the furnishing of a Train of Artillery proportionable to the faid Army.

Bruffels, Nov. 1. Don Eftevan de Gamarra the Spanish Ambaliador is lately arrived here from Holland upon one of the States Yachts, and this evening had a private conference with the Constable of Casille, who is lately removed from his Pallace to a house on the other fide the Park, and has sent away a considerable part of his Coods, for Spain.

for spain. The States of Brabant have had leveral days Conference, about the best ways and method of entertaining their proportion of Horle and Foot a ter the example given by those of Flanders.

The French pas daily as they please in great bodies through our Territories, and have obliged the Farmers of Estates within their late Conquests of such periods as, live within the Spanish juris istion to pay all Rens. which have been due to their Landlords for the years 1667, and 1668, to such perions as they have appointed to be Receivers, and intend likewile to collect the Rents for this p efent year.

The Marquis de Louvoy has lately visited the new Cittadel at Tourray, where he has been liberally Treated, at which time he gave names to all the Bastiors of the said Cittadel, which was done with some solemnity, and the discharge of several Volleys of ther Cannon, and is fince, gone from thence to Duskirk.

Lynne, Oftob. 29. On Saturday laft in the afternoon was put on thoar at Wells a Flemish built thip of about 250 Tuns laden with Deal-boards, Masts and other Norway Goods, but without Masts or any perion aboard her; the is a broad Sterned ship, and upon the Stern, some mention, made that the belonged to East-Friessand.

Briffol, Oftob. 29. Several Wrecks have been feen of late in this Channel occasion'd by the tempestuous weathers we have not yet any news of the ships of this place which have been for some weeks expected from Barbadoy, which gives us reason to apprehend the stuth of the report of the great Hurrican upon those Coasts.

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
