The Order becomes operative as from the 6th day of June, 1958, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

THORNBURY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

The Thornbury Rural District Council (Parish of Redwick and Northwick No. 1) Extinguishment Order, 1958.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 23rd day of May, 1958, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Redwick and Northwick in the County of Gloucester.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish the following public rights of way:—

(1) The public right of way approximately 657 yards in length extending from the northernmost corner of the field numbered 170 on the Ordnance Survey Map for the said Parish (1920 Edition) in the south-westerly direction to the point of its junction with the footpath on the western boundary of the field numbered 352 on the said Ordnance Survey Map.
