Rome, July 11. N. S.

Signior Fieschi is lately returned from France, where he has resided for some time with the Character of Nuncio Extraordinary: The Pope has given him the Archbishoprick of Genoa, and has named Signior Gontieri to succeed him in that of Avignon. The Marquis of Bedmar, who is lately appointed Vice-Roy of Sicily, having made a short stay in this City, proceeded on the 30th past towards Naples; and we have since received an Account of his being arrived there; and that 5 Gallies were come thither from Messina to attend him in his Passage to that Port. The Pope having some weeks ago caused Signior Cavalleri, a Gentleman of the Imperial Ambassador's Retinue, to be imprisoned for some Misdemeanor, his Excellency made great Complaints of this Proceeding, as being a Violation of the Privileges belonging to his Character; whereupon the Pope dispatched an Express to his Nuncio at Vienna, who returning the 3d Instant, a Congregation was held the next day to consult upon the Matter, wherein it was resolved, That Signior Cavalleri should immediately be discharged out of Custody; which was done accordingly. The Nuncio having at the same time given the Pope an Account, That it was ill resented at the Imperial Court, that the French have been permitted by him to possess themselves of Mezzola, and other Posts in the Ferrareze, he has dispatched an Express to the French Court, with Complaints of this Proceeding of their Troops, as being inconsistent with the Neutrality, which he professes himself desirous to observe between the several Contending Parties. There being Advice from Spain, That a certain Fryar, accused of a Conspiracy against the Government, had been seized at Granada, and was proceeded against before the Civil Courts, without any Regard had to the Ecclesiastical Immunities, a particular Congregation is appointed to consider of that Affair.

Warsaw, July 18. On the 11th Instant the Marshal of the Confederacy, which sides with the new Elected King Stanislaus, arrived here, with 3 Deputies from the Palatinate of Lencici, being guarded by a Body of Swedish Horse. He repaired to the Castle, and went into the Room where the Diet usually meets, where, notwithstanding the small number of Deputies that were present, he opened the Assembly with a Speech, telling them, That they were met in pursuance of Summons issued by the Cardinal Primate, in order to treat of several Matters of high Concern to the Kingdom: After which they adjourned to this day; when being met again, and the Assembly being increased to 14 in number, they confirmed the Marshal in his Office, and resolved, That he should write to the Cardinal Primate, to invite him hither; to the King of Sweden, to pray him to send Deputies to enter into a Treaty with the Diet, for the restoring of the Peace of the Kingdom; and to the new Elected King, to beg of him to intercede with his Swedish Majesty, that he will order Parties to be sent out to guard the Deputies that are expected here, the Castellan Smigi-

elsky being yet in our Neighbourhood with a Body of Troops, who gives frequent Alarms to the Swedish Forces that are posted hereabouts for the Security of this Diet. We hear that the Czar was expected the 12th Instant at Wilna.

Berlin, July 25. The King of Prussia went the 20th Instant to Wutterhausen, and the 22d to Potsdam, where his Majesty is at present. Monsieur Prebendow, Ambassador from Poland, is expected here this day from Saxony, where he has been to wait upon the King his Master, who, according to our last Advices from thence, was taking a Review of his Troops in their several Camps, and making Preparations for their March into Poland. Six hundred Saxons, being part of those who were taken Prisoners at Thorn when the Swedes possessed themselves of that Place, have lately been brought to Saxony, in Exchange for an equal number of Swedish Prisoners. A considerable number of Troops have been lately brought by Sea from Sweden to Poland, and part of them have already passed by Stetin, in their March to Rawitz, where the King of Sweden still has his head Quarters.

Kinsale, July 20. The Expedition Packet-Boat, Captain Clyes Commander, is just now arrived here from Lisbon, having been 22 days in her Passage. About three days before she came away part of the Confederate Fleet sailed towards the Streights, under the Command of Sir Cloudesly Shovell, and the Earl of Peterborough intended to follow in few days with the remainder.

Falmouth, July 23. Her Majesty's Ships the Southampton and Lizard sailed hence yesterday, with about 80 Sail of Colliers and other Vessels under their Convoy. This day came in the Alliance Packet-Boat, Captain Green Commander, from Lisbon, whence she set sail the 12th Instant: She brings an Account, That the Prince of Hesse-Darmstadt came thither the 5th, on board Her Majesty's Ship the Leopard, from Gibraltar, to confer with the Earl of Peterborough, and the other Generals; and on the 11th his Highness failed back on board the same Ship for Gibraltar; That the Earl of Peterborough would part from Lisbon in two or three days, with the Men of War, Transports, &c. having on board a considerable number of Land Forces; and the King of Spain himself designed to go on board; That Sir Cloudesly Shovell was cruising in the Streights Mouth with the rest of the Fleet; And that it was said there was an Insurrection in Catalonia in Favour of the House of Austria: And all Advices from those
