Draft Gravel and Sand Quarries (Overhanging) (Exemption) Regulations, 1958.

(Exemption) Regulations, 1958. The Minister of Power, in accordance with the pro-visions of section 142 of, and Part I of the Second Schedule to, the Mines and Quarries Act, 1954, hereby gives notice that he intends to make General Regulations under sections 141 and 108 of the Act, entitled the Gravel and Sand Quarries (Overhanging) (Exemption) Regulations, 1958. Section 108 (2) of the Act requires every manager

Section 108 (2) of the Act requires every manager of a quarry to secure that in no part of the quarry to which his jurisdiction extends shall the face or sides of the quarry or any gallery thereon be so worked as to cause overhanging. The Regulations will apply to every quarry of gravel or sand in which any of the mineral is normally got from under water and, in relation to every such quarry, will exempt from that requirement every part in which gravel or sand is normally got in this way. The Regulations will also provide for the making of rules to secure that employees are not at any time in danger from a fall of an overhanging face or side, and will require precautions to be taken to prevent any person from accidentally gaining access to any ground which may be liable to fall by reason of such overhanging. It is proposed that the new Regulations should come into force on 19th Septem-ber, 1958. Section 108 (2) of the Act requires every manager ber, 1958.
