The Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 17) Order, 1958, which exempts certain cylindrical blocks of granite from duty under the Import Duties Act, 1932.

#### *International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950*

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6, Chapter 14) Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following amendments to the list published in the London Gazette of November 29, 1957, as amended by notices published on January 17, 1958, February 21, 1958 and April 29, 1958, of persons who are entitled to immunities and privileges conferred by the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges of the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation) Order, 1954.
