Footpath through Fields, Ordnance Numbers 141 and 141A Parish of Temple Sowerby Diversion Order, 1956

Notice is hereby given that on the 22nd day of August 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modification the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish a public right of way on foot which commences at a gate in Vicarage Lane, Temple Sowerby, leading into a field (O.S. No. 141A) belonging to Mr. Thomas Stephenson of Park House Farm, from which it runs in a South Westerly direction to the boundary fence of the field and then in a Southerly direction as far as the South Easterly boundary fence of the adjoining field and then along this fence to the public footpath on the bank of the River Eden, and to create a public right of way on foot which will run from the stile at the end of Vicarage Lane in a South Westerly direction near the boundary fence of the field until it joins the public footpath on the bank of the River Eden. The right of way to be extinguished will be closed at the expiration of 14 days from the date of confirmation of the Order.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Kirkby Stephen, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays (Saturdays until 12 noon). The Order becomes operative as from the 2nd day of September 1958, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the

approval of the Order he may, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

City of Portsmouth (Pathway off Edinburgh Road) Extinguishment Order
