which is that a by-pass which he proposes to construct at Harbledown in the County of Kent will become a trunk road on the date when the Order comes into operation and the length of the London—Canterbury—Dover Trunk Road to be superseded thereby will cease to be a trunk road on the 1st day of April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the County Council of Kent (who will thereafter become the highway authority responsible for that road) that the by-pass is opened for through traffic.

(a) to authorise the Minister to provide a special road from points on the London—Canterbury —Dover Trunk Road (A.2) at Cobham in the County of Kent approximately 740 and 480 yards west of its junction with Roman Road (Watling Street) in a general south-easterly direction passing to the south of Strood, Rochester, Chatham and Gillingham; thence in a north-easterly direction passing to the south of Rainham and Hartlip; thence in a south-easterly direction passing to the south of Sittingbourne; thence in a general easterly direction passing to the south of Faversham; then in a northerly direction to a point on the Kent Coastal Road (A.299) approximately 170 yards north-east of its junction with the said Trunk Road. The special road shall be for the exclusive use of motor vehicles of Classes I and II as set out in the Second Schedule to the Special Roads Act, 1949, except on those parts of the section of the special road between Cuxton Road (A.228) and Wouldham Road where footpaths are to be provided for the use of Classes VI in so far as all forms of baby carriage are comprised therein, vIII in so far as dogs are comprised therein, and IX; and separate tracks are to be provided for the use of Class VII.

- (b) to authorise the Minister to construct as part of the special road a bridge carrying it over the navigable waters of the River Medway;
- (c) to authorise the Minister to construct as part of the special road roads as a means of giving entry to and exit from the special road;
- (d) to provide that the special road in so far as it is to be provided by new construction will become a trunk road on the date of coming into operation of the Scheme.

Waiting Restrictions
Borough of Barking

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation in accordance with the London Traffic Act, 1924, section 10, as amended, proposes to refer to the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee for their advice and report a proposal that he should make Regulations to restrict waiting by vehicles between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in:

- London Road, from its junction with East Street north-westwards for a distance of 27 yards.
- Ripple Road, from its junction with East Street southwards for a distance of 38 yards.

(Exemptions will be provided in the Regulations to permit vehicles to wait—to pick up and set down passengers, to load and unload goods, to carry out essential services, or while in use by local authorities in an emergency.)
