That length of the Ipswich—Weedon Trunk Road (Route A.428) at Great Barford, Beds, from a point 717 yards north-east of its junction with Green End Road south-westwards for a distance of 1,110 yards.

One-Way Traffic Working, Prohibited Right Hand Turn and Prohibited Entry Metropolitan Borough of Islington.

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation in accordance with the London Traffic Act, 1924, section 10, as amended, proposes to refer to the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee for their advice and report a proposal that in connection with the reconstruction of the Highbury Corner junction he should make Regulations:

- (a) to institute one-way traffic working in a clockwise direction in those parts of Upper Street, St. Paul's Road and Canonbury Road which, together with a new link road between Upper Street and Canonbury Road, will form a large roundabout.
- (b) to prohibit vehicles from making a right hand turn from Corsica Street into St. Paul's Road, and
- (c) to prohibit vehicles entering Hampton Court from Upper Street.

Land Drainage Act, 1930
Ure Internal Drainage District

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming, with modifications, a Scheme submitted to him by the Yorkshire Ouse River Board, under section 4 (1) (b) of

that Act, as applied by the River Boards Act, 1948, making provision for the following matters:

(i) The constitution of an Internal Drainage District to be known as the Ure Internal Drainage District, and of an Internal Drainage Board for the said Internal Drainage District.

(ii) The abolition of the existing Aldborough, Dunsforth, Holbeck and River Tutt Internal Drainage Districts, and of the Internal Drainage Boards thereof.

(iii) Matters supplemental to or consequential thereon.

The Scheme affects lands in the parishes of Littlethorpe, Givendale, Bishop Monkton, Burton Leonard, Copgrove, Roecliffe, Westwick, Staveley, Wakingham Hill with Occaney, Brearton, Scotton, Farnham, Boroughbridge, Marton-cum-Grafton, Lower Dunsforth, Upper Dunsforth with Branton Green and Great Ouseburn.

The Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless within thirty-five days from the date of this notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial, praying that the Order shall be subject to special parliamentary procedure.

We the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, section four, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1866, section five, and the Church Commissioners Measure, 1947, section two,

Do hereby grant to the incumbent of the benefice of Saint James, Moulton, in the county and diocese of Lincoln, and to his successors, incumbents for the time being of the same benefice, an annual sum of fifty pounds to be payable out of our general fund
