Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, a Mercedes motor car registration No. P 459 BZ has been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that

- (1) the said car was imported at Dover on 20th January 1958, contrary to the prohibition for the time being in force with respect thereto by virtue of the Import of Goods (Control) Order, 1954;
- (2) the said car, being goods chargeable with a duty of Customs was unshipped at Dover on 20th January 1958, without payment of that duty,

whereby and by force of section 44 (a) and (b) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, the said car is liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said car is not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act
