Francfort, Sept. 2. The Imperial Army commanded by Prince Lewis repalled the Rhine the 22d past at Dirmesheim Prince Lewis repassed the Rhine the 22d past at Dirmessem and Steinmar, and encamped at Lauterbourg; General La Tour, with 12000 Men, having been left on the other tide of that River to guard the Lines of Buhl and Stolhessen. The 28th his Highness advanced towards the French Lines near Haguenau, and forced them at Pfassenhossen with inconsiderable Loss. Our Army encamped near the Town last mentioned; as the French Army did between Haguenau and Bischweiler: But we hear that Prince Lewis is since advanced nearer to Haguenau; and that the Enemy are revised more towards strasbourg. The Prussan Forces which were marching towards the Netherlands being countermanded; repassed the Main this day at Mentz, in order to join Prince Lewis.

They write from Poland, That the Czar of Mulcovy is marched with his A my towards Courland: And Letters from thence of the 24th paft fay, That a Detachment of Muscovites had taken Post in the Town of Mirau, and intended to attack the Castle, in which was a Garison of 500 Swedes: And that another Body of Muscovite Forces was marched towards Riga, in order to beliege it. The Troops which the King of Poland has drawn together in Saxony are marched towards Poland: And, according to our Advices from Sielia, General Reinschild, who commands the Swedish Troops that were left on the Borders of that Connery, is come with them to Meseritz, with intent to oppose the Saxons passing the Oder. Letters from Dantzick of the 30th pass say, That General Lewenhaupt, with the Body of Swedish Forces under his Command, was retired to Riga. The King of Sweder was near Warsaw with 1000 Men of his own Forces, and expected more to join him.

N.S. The 28th of the laft Month our Army and our Artillery were drawn out, and made a triple Discharge of their Cannon and small Arms, by way of Rejoycing for the Advantage gained by Prin.e Eugene over the Enemy's Force in Italy. The 29th the Two Armies marched from Rame; that which is commanded by his Grace the Duke of Marlborough encamped with the Right ar Weser, and the Left at Hakendover, between the Rivers Geete and Gias; and the Army of the States, under the Command of Monsicur d'Auverqueque, encamped between Hale and Landen. Lieutenant-General Dedem being detached at the same time with 15 Battalions and as many Squadrons, to take Post before Leawe, invested that Place the same evening; and part of the Artillery to be employed in the Siege was sent thinter from the Camp, it erest being expected from Mashicht. The Enemy in the mean time continued on the other side the Dyle, their Camp being streached out nearer to Lovain. The first Initant in the moming the Train of Artillery which was to be employed in the Siege of Leuwe set out from Mashicht, and arrived this afternoon before the Place; It consisted of 16 Twenty sour Pounders, besides 4 that were sent from the Army, and 12 Mortars. At the same time our Men began to work on the Batteries, 2nd in two days time similer one for 10 Guns, and another for 6 Mortars; and the other Batteries were in such forwardness, that they would have been ready to fire the 5th in the morning: But the 3d in the even

A Courier arrived here the 6th Instant at Night with the News of the Taking of Leuwe; the Garifon having furrender'd as foon as they faw our Batteries finished, and before one Cannon had been fired against them. It is faid our Forces in Flanders are to attack the Fort of Sant-vliet, near Lillo. General Fagel, who comman-ded the Forces of this State in Portugal, is recalled. The Letters from Paris, which came in this Day, confirm the Arrival of the Confederate Fleet before Barcelona the 22d; and add, That we had landed 10000 Men there, who had been joined by 2 or 3000, other Advices fay 5000, Malecontents from Vick; but they give no further Particulars, only, That the Inhabitants of Barcelona being in their King Charles the Third's Interest, the Governor had planted some Guns in convenient Places to keep them in Awe, and had forrified the Castle on that side which is next the Town. By their last Advices from Italy, the French Army under the Duke de la Feuillade was still at the Venerie: They had nothing new from that which is commanded by the Duke de Vendosme.

Dublin, August 28. This day having been appointed by the Lords Justices to be observed as a Day of publick.
