Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing the date the 13th day of November 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of (1) the parishes of Writtle; Broomfield; and Saint James and Saint Mary, Chignal; and (2) the district of The Ascension, Chelmsford, all of which parishes and district are situate in the diocese of Chelmsford.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution.*

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Andrew, Chelmsford.'

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.*

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Southend and in the rural deanery of Chelmsford.

"THE SCHEDULE

The area coloured pink on the map annexed hereto comprising:—

"(a) parts of the parish of Writtle,

"(b) two detached parts of the parish of Bloomfield,

"(c) two detached parts of the parish of Saint James and Saint Mary, Chignal, and

"(d) part of the district of The Ascension, Chelmsford,

all of which, taken together, are bounded by a continuous line, partly imaginary and partly following existing parochial boundaries, commencing at a point (hereinafter referred to as 'point A') where the boundaries of (i) the parishes of Widford and Writtle and (ii) the district of The Ascension, Chelmsford, all meet in the middle of the River Can and proceeding thence southwestwards along the middle of the River Can to a point opposite the boundary of the Municipal Borough of Chelmsford; thence generally northwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to the point where it meets the boundary dividing the parish of Writtle from a detached part parish of Saint James and Saint Mary, Chignal, thence westwards and generally northeastwards along the last mentioned boundary and along the boundaries which divide the parish of Writtle and the parish of Saint James and Saint Mary, Chignal, including a detached part thereof, from detached

parts of the parishes of Broomfield and Writtle to the boundary of the parish of Broomfield; thence generally southwards along the last mentioned boundary to the eastern end of the southern boundary of close number 3286 on the said map; thence westwards along the last mentioned boundary and southwards along the eastern boundary of close number 1660 on the map and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Melbourne Avenue; thence westwards along the middle of Melbourne Avenue to a point opposite the middle of Langton Avenue; thence southwards to and along the middle of Langton Avenue to a point opposite the northern boundary of the house and premises numbered 99, Langton Avenue; thence westwards to and along the last named boundary and along the boundaries at the rear of the houses and premises numbered 55 and 57, Melbourne Avenue; thence generally southwards along the boundaries at the rear of the houses and premises on the western side of Langton Avenue and numbered from 97 to 63 inclusive; thence first westwards and southwards along the boundary of close number 3409 on the map and then southwards and southwestwards along the boundary of close number 1794 on the map; thence northwards and westwards along the boundaries at the rear of the houses and premises on the east and north sides of Highfield Road as far as No. 94 Highfield Road inclusive; thence southwards along the western boundary of the last mentioned house and premises and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Highfield Road; thence southwards and westwards along the middle of Pines Road and Winchester Drive and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of Chignal Road on the boundary dividing the parish of Writtle and the district of The Ascension, Chelmsford; thence generally southwards and eastwards along the last mentioned boundary to point A."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Measure.

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of November 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Tom, Bishop of Hereford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Llangarron and the benefice of Christ Church, Long Grove, otherwise Llangrove, both situate in the diocese of Hereford.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Llangarron and the benefice of Christ Church, Long Grove, otherwise Llangrove, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Llangarron with Llangrove' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the
