Etters from Nice confirm the Count de Tou-s louse's Arrival at Touton, where he was louie's Arrival at Tonion, where he was raising and arming the Militia. The French Battalions which lately marched from the Country of Nice, are to be posted at Antibes, and other Places along that Coast. The 20th instant a Party of our Huslats met with another of 30 French Horse, between Chivas and the Venerie, of whom they killed about half, and brought away the rest Prisoners The 21st a Body of the Enemy came to Lufin, a little Village about a Mile from hence, where they committed great Diforders. The 22d a Party of they committed great Differences. The 224 2 Party of our Hullars surprised a Forage-Guard of the Enemy near the Venerie, consisting of a Lieurenant, and 30 Men, who were all killed; after which the Hustiss brought away with them 90 Horses and 200 Sheep. They made this Expedition in four hours time, and runned without any Lois on their fide. The 23d mother Party of out Hullars made an Excursion towards Chivas, and came back with 50 Horses and Mules. These Excursions give great Trouble to the Enemy, who dare not fire out of their Camp but in frong Parties. The 24th early in the morning a Deachment of 500 of the Enemy's Horse, and as many Foot, came over the Doire, with intent, as is believed; whave surprised our Foragers; but they retired without any manner of Success. This day arrived a Couier from Vienna, being fent to Count Guido Staremberg, with Bills for a confiderable Sum of Money for the Use of the Imperial Forces under his Command.

Zuitek Sept. 9. Letters from Milan of the 5th Inflant give an Account, That the Imperial and the french and Spanish Armies were still in the same Camps, the former at Treviglio, and the latter at Rivolta: That they had lately had much rainy Weather, which had swelled the Adda, and made the Passage of that River very difficult; however Prince Engene still seemed to have a Design of attempting it; And that the Duke do la Feuillade expected a Reinforcement from France to enable him to undertake the Siege of Turin. By the same way we have Advice from Spain; That the Confederate Fleet was come spon the Coast of Catalonia; and that the Viceroy (who governs there for the Duke of Anjou) continued at Barcelona, and was providing for the Desence of that Place; but lay under great Difficulties, by reason of the strong Inclination of the Inhabitants for their King Charles the Third; and that he had been obliged to send 12 of the Chief of them out of the Town, to confine the Monks to their Convents; they being generally for their King's Interest, and to take other Precautions for the preventing of an Insurinction in savour of his Catholick Majesty.

Birlin, Sept. 12. Monsieur H usch, Resident f om the House of Lunenbourg, had Audience of the King of Proffia the 6th instant; and delivered to his Majesty a Letter from the Elector of Hanover, notifying the Death of the Duke of Zell: Whereupon the young Count of Wartenfleben, one of his Majesty's Chamberlains, was feat from hence the 9th towards. Hanover, with a Compliment of Condoleance upon this Occasion; and with one of Congratulation, upon the late Marriage, between the Electoral Prince of Hanover and the Paleon of Authority and the Paleon of Authority nover and the Princels of Anipach; and upon the great Succession which, by the Death of the Duke of Zell, is fallen to his Electoral Highness, that Dutchy being thereby United to that of Hanover The Count-of Wattenfleben is also to go to Zell to make a Com-pliment of Condoleance in his Majesty's Name to the Dutchess Dowager. Our last Advices from Mittau are; That the Czar was come thither with a confiderable Body of his Forces, and had caused Barteries to be raised against the Castle in order to attack it as soon as his heavy Artillery should be come up : The Swedish Governor appeared resolved to make a vigorous Delence, and threaten'd to ruine the Town if the Muscovites did not relie out of it. These Letters add, That the Swedes quitted Libau on the 3 ift past; that the Muscovires had pur a Garison into Goldingen; and that Riga was faid to be actually lovested; Letters from Warlaw of the 4th Instant say, That, three Swedish Commissioners being lately arrived there; had had Audience of the new Elected King Stanislaus; who had named Deputies to renew the Treaty that was formerly begun between his Swedish Majesty, and that part of the Nobility of Poland which is in his Interest. There have been warm Disputes in the Assembly, which is now held at Warfaw by Virtue of the new Elected King's Summons, concerning the Pope's intermeddling with the Affairs of their State : And it is faid they have refolved to write to the Cardinal Primate, to come rhither from Dantzick, not-withflanding the Pope's Censure; and at the same time to send a Remonstrance upon this Subject to the Court of Rome.

Hague, Sepr. 18. N. S. The States of Holland and Westfriseland, which have sat here some time, intend to separate to morrow; and have resolved to send Monsieur Buis Pentionary to Amsterdam, to the Army in Brabant, to confer upon feveral Matters with his Grace the Duke of Marlborough. They have taken a Resolution to Banish four Jesuits and a Dominican Fryar, for oppoling the Billiop of Sc Sebasta, whom they had appointed Vicar-General over the Roman Catholicks in this Country: And the Pope having caused the faid Bissiop to be seized in the Country of Juliers, they have further declared in their Resolution abovementioned, That if the Court of Rome does not speedily release him, and give a reasonable Satisfaction to the Roman Catholicks who are desirous to have him their Vicar-General, such of the Romish Clergy as pretend to oppose him shall be proceeded against with due Severity. Letters from Paris which came in this day give an Account, That Couriers arrived daily at the French Court from Catalonia; but the Advices they brought were kept Secret. Letters by the last Post from Madrid also bring the News of an Insurrection in the Kingdom of Valentia, where those who are for the House of Austria have possessed themselves of the Towns of Denia, Davila, and Danet.
