

turned yesterday to this Place, near the Right of the Line; and the Troops which were in Tirlmont, having destroyed the Gates in order to lay the Place open, have this day joyn'd the Army, which will March to morrow towards Diest. A Detachment of five Men out of each Battalion of the Army is ordered to reinforce the Garrison of Leuwe, which is to remain there till it is relieved by the Troops that shall be appointed for the Winter Garrison. Major-General Walkenshoven, Quartermaster-General to the Elector Palatine's Troops, came hither last night, being sent by Prince Lewis of Baden, to concert several Matters with his Grace in relation to the further Operations of the Campaign, and the Winter-Quarters for the Troops.

Hague, Sept. 18. N. S. The States of Holland and Westfriseland, which have sat here some time, intend to separate to morrow; and have resolv'd to send Monsieur Buis Pensionary to Amsterdam, to the Army in Brabant, to confer upon several Matters with his Grace the Duke of Marlborough. They have taken a Resolution to Banish four Jesuits and a Dominican Fryar, for opposing the Bishop of St. Sebastia, whom they had appointed Vicar-General over the Roman Catholics in this Country: And the Pope having caused the said Bishop to be seized in the Country of Juliers, they have further declared in their Resolution above-mentioned, That if the Court of Rome does not speedily release him, and give a reasonable Satisfaction to the Roman Catholics who are desirous to have him their Vicar-General, such of the Romish Clergy as pretend to oppose him shall be proceeded against with due Severity. Letters from Paris which came in this day give an Account, That Couriers arriv'd daily at the French Court from Catalonia; but the Advices they brought were kept Secret. Letters by the last Post from Madrid also bring the News of an Insurrection in the Kingdom of Valentia, where those who are for the House of Austria have possess'd themselves of the Towns of Denia, Davila, and Damer. There are Letters from France which mention a new Rising in the Cévennes, where the Malcontents have formed two considerable Bodies of Men, one commanded by one Claris, the other by a Person who calls himself Porte Frayeur.

Dartmouth, Sept. 9. Two of Her Majesty's Ships fail'd out of Torbay the 7th instant, being Convoy to about 50 light Colliers bound from this Place and Topham for Wales. The Eleanor and Mary Ketch of this Place arriv'd here last night from Portsmouth, whence she came in Company of about 34 Sail of Merchantmen and Chasters, Convoy'd by three of Her Majesty's Ships, which are all pass'd by to the Westward.

Portsmouth, Sept. 10. A Fleet of laden Colliers, under Convoy of some of Her Majesty's Ships, pass'd through our Road, and on the Back of our Sands, the 8th instant, to the Southward.
