EXPLANATORY NOTES

National Insurance (Contributions) Amendment Regulations, 1959

These Regulations amend the National Insurance (Contributions) Regulations, 1948. Regulation 5 provides for the purposes of excep-tion and credits for weeks of unemployment or incapacity for work that Sunday (or any other sabbath day which a person may observe) is to be disregarded, in the sense that it is not to prevent a mark from heing a week of unemployment or inbe ensregarded, in the sense that it is not to prevent a week from being a week of unemployment or in-capacity, unless the person concerned works on that day as an employed or self-employed person and that certain disqualifications which would have applied on a claim to benefit are to apply. It further provides for the purposes of exception and credits for weeks of unemployment that holiday paycredits for weeks of unemployment that holiday pay-ments which are or are not deemed to be remunera-tion for the purposes of liability to pay contributions shall or shall not respectively prevent a day from being a day of unemployment and that Sunday is to be treated as a day of unemployment notwithstand-ing a person's subsequent employment to the full ex-tent normal in his case if some other sabbath day has been substituted for that Sunday as the dis-regarded day

has been substituted for that Sunday as the dis-regarded day. Regulation 10 makes it a condition of a person's right to be credited with contributions for weeks of unemployment that he shall attend at an employment exchange on days for which he does not claim bene-fit, as persons claiming benefit are required to do, and shall if the Minister so directs furnish other evidence that those days were days of unemploy-ment ment.

Consequential amendments are made by Regula-tions 2 to 4. The remaining Regulations make a number of other minor amendments.

National Insurance (Determination of Claims and Questions) Amendment Regulations, 1959

These Regulations amend the National Insurance (Determination of Claims and Questions) Regula-tions, 1948, in order to give effect to Regulation 5 (3) of the National Insurance (Contributions) Amendment Regulations, 1959, under which certain disqualifications applicable to claims to benefit are to apply also to the right to be excepted from hability to pay and credited with contributions because of unemologement or sickness.

to pay and credited with contributions because of unemployment or sickness. Regulation 3 provides that questions whether a per-son would, if otherwise entialed therto, have been disqualified for receiving unemployment or sickness benefit by virtue of subsection (2) or (3) of section 13 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, or of regula-tions made thereunder, shall not be decided by the Minister; instead they are to be decided by insur-ance officers, local tribunals or the Commissioner in the same way as other questions as to the right to benefit.
