PANARTH URBAN DISTRICT

- 15 That section over railway property, of footpath commencing on Labernock Road and proceeding to Lower Penarth station approach and turning north-west to terminate at junction of Labernock Road and Westbourne Road.

PONTYPRIDD URBAN DISTRICT

- 104 That section from junction with path 105 220 yards south-east of railway bridge to termination at Craig-y-Fforest, of the footpath commencing at railway bridge at north-west end of Forest Grove and running south-east and south to junction with Heol-y-cawl road at Craig-y-Fforest.
- 64 That section on railway property on north-east side of line of the footpath commencing at Maesycoed Road at subway under Barry railway and proceeding to Kirkhouse Street, the Graig.
- 29 That section over railway level crossing, of the footpath commencing at the foot of the south embankment on the Pontypridd, Caerphilly and Newport railway, thence east over railway (Dynea Halt) to top of north-east embankment.
- 37 That section under railway bridge, of the footpath commencing on Groeswen Road south-east of Cae-ty-du Cottages, then north along accommodation road to the yard of Tir-Thomas-James.
- 32 That section over railway bridge, of the footpath commencing on A.470 at Treforest Estate and 400 yards south-west of Tyn-y-Wern Farm, then over old Cardiff Railway and Nantgarw Colliery sidings to Tyn-y-Wern farmyard.

PART TWO

Ways to be added to the Map and Statement

ABERDARE URBAN DISTRICT

- Footpath from western corner of Recreation Ground, Colliers Row, Abernant, across Golf Course to a point 80 yards north of the wood (Crichton Drift).
- Footpath commencing at Tanyard Place, Aberaman, and proceeding southwards to the accommodation crossing on the Cwmaman Branch old railway, crossing this line and proceeding past Gwawr House, then south-westwards to eastern end of tramway from old quarry and along this tramway to the quarry.
- Footpath connecting paths 134 and 135.
- Footpath from junction of paths 47 and 48 at Llwydcoed, south-west and south-east to road leading to level crossing.

CAERPHILLY URBAN DISTRICT

- Towpath of former Glamorganshire Canal from Nantgarw towards Taffs Well.
- Footpath from termination of path No. 36 on parish road north-west of Blaen Ivor Farm, north-eastwards across Mynydd Eglwysylan to join path No. 47.

GLYNCORRWG URBAN DISTRICT

- Footpath from the junction of paths 203, 205 and 209, south-eastwards to Twyn-yr-Afan and then, after following path 46 for half a mile, southwards with one branch proceeding to join paths 51 and 40 and another branch to join path 37 at Ogmere Vale.
- Footpath from Route A.4107, southwards over Penhydd Mountain into Port Talbot Borough.

LLWCHWR URBAN DISTRICT

- Footpath from junction of bridleway 80 with footpath 81 on Goppa Hill, eastwards and then northwards, crossing stream and railway to join road.
- Footpath from Brynawel to Gelliern Ganol to Gelliern Fawr to Llidard-y-Cleders.

MOUNTAIN ASH URBAN DISTRICT

- Footpath near Caerphilly U.D. boundary, leaving roadway about 350 yards on Llanfabon side of Garth Hill and joining Cilfynydd-Llanfabon Road.
- Footpath on hillside above Glenboi, leaving path 27 about 200 yards north of its junction with path 26 and proceeding over hillside to Maen Trigwr, and thence to junction of paths 171 and 83.
- Footpath leaving path No. 70 near Pentwyn Isaf Farm and proceeding west-north-west to join road running along top of ridge.

OGMORE AND GARW URBAN DISTRICT

- Footpaths from junction of paths 203, 205 and 209, south-eastwards to Twyn Crug-yr-Avon and then, after following path 46 for half a mile, southwards with one branch proceeding to junction of paths 51 and 40 and another branch to join path 37 near its junction with path 71 at Ogmere Vale.

CUCKFIELD RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cuckfield Rural District Council (Parish of West Hoathly No. 1) Diversion Order, 1958

Notice is hereby given that on the 19th day of February 1959, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order was to divert on the 12th day of March 1959, the public right of way running from north to south at a point south of Chiddinglye to the southern point of Winter Field, West Hoathly, in the County of Sussex.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the offices of the Rural District Council of Cuckfield, Boltro Road, Haywards Heath, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 20th day of March 1959, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation

made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
