METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF STOKE NEWINGTON

The Stoke Newington (No. 3) Smoke Control Order, 1959

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the Metropolitan Borough of Stoke Newington in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11, of the above-mentioned Act on the 25th day of March 1959, made an Order entitled the Stoke Newington (No. 3) Smoke Control Order, 1959 declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

2. Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

3. If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before 1st January 1960, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

4. Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Stoke Newington Church Street, London N.16, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from 13th April 1959.

5. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

DROYLSDEN URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Droylsden No. 1 Smoke Control Order, 1959

1. Notice is hereby given that the Droylsden Urban District Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 24th day of March 1959, made an Order entitled the "Droylsden No. 1 Smoke Control Order, 1959" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

2. Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

3. If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of March 1960, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

4. Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Droylsden, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 3rd day of April 1959.
