THE FAIRS ACT, 1873

The Alteration of Dates (Machynlleth Fair) Order, 1959

Whereas representations have been made to me by the Machynlleth Urban District Council that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public if the fair which is held annually at Machynlleth on the third Saturday in September were held on the eighteenth day of September or, when that day falls on a Sunday, then on the Monday immediately next following:

And whereas notice of the said representations and of the time when they will be considered by me has been published in accordance with the provisions of section six of the Fairs Act, 1873(a):

And whereas it appears to me after considering the said representations that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public if the day on which the said fair is used to be held were altered:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Richard Austen Butler, C.H., M.P., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section six of the Fairs

Act, 1873, do hereby order that the said fair shall be held annually on the eighteenth day of September except when that day falls on a Sunday in which case the fair shall be held on the nineteenth day of September.
