THE Congregation of State, and that of the Inquisition, meet very frequently; the latter to examine into some Complaints that have been made of Abuses committed by our Clergy, both Regular and Secular; the other has principally under Consideration the Differences with the Court of Vienna, and what Methods are to be taken for bringing Matters to an Accommodation; and in hopes that this may be effected, Signior Davia, the Pope's Nuncio at Vienna, is not yet recalled, altho' he has some time since been forbid the Imperial Court; and that the Emperor's Ambassador to the Pope is actually returning thither; all Affairs at this Court that may relate to the Emperor or his Subjects being, in his Excellency's Absence, transacted by Monsieur Cauniz, the Emperor's Auditor de Rota. The Queen Dowager of Poland is indisposed, They write from Maltha of the 12th Instant, That the Gallies belonging to that Island were lately come into Port; but that several of them would shortly put to Sea again, upon some Expedition which was kept private.

Venice, October 24. Signior Pietro Venier, Procurator of St. Mark, being lately dead, the Great Council is to meet to-morrow to proceed to the Election of a Person to succeed him in that Dignity. The Magistrates of this City, to whom is committed the Care of keeping it healthy, have repealed an Order made in July last, for the obliging of all Ships which came from Sardinia and the neighbouring Islands to perform their Quarantain, there being an Account, that the contagious Distemper they had in those Parts is entirely ceased; But they have issued an Order of that nature in relation to Persons or Goods coming from Poland, upon Advice that a Pestilential Disease rages in Russland. They write from Constantinople, that a Fire had lately happened there, which destroyed about 6000 Houses. Letters from the Cremoneze say, That on the 16th Instant the Imperial Army under Prince Eugene, and that of France and Spain which is commanded by the Duke of Vendosme, cannonaded each other several hours near Mondodena, the River Serio being betwixt them; and the next day the Imperialists decamped, and were advancing towards Carravagio; and the Enemy were marching the same way to observe them. Prince Eugene has put a strong Garrison into Palazzuolo, in which place are the Hospitals for his sick Men; and has provided that Town with all Necessaries for its Defence.

Bergamo, October 27. The Imperial Army came the 20th Instant to Fontanella; whereupon the Duke of Vendosme advanced with his Forces, and encamped at Ticengo; and on the 23d sent a Detachment to attack Sencino, which Place surrendered at Discretion. The French have since detached a Body of Troops to besiege Palazzuolo, and the Im-

perialists have made some Motions as if they intended to relieve that Place; but it is thought they will rather march towards Lodi and Piacentia, to secure themselves of the Bridges there, in order to advance into the Cremoneze and Mantuan, to take Winter Quarters in those Countries.

Ratisbon, Nov. 1. Cardinal Lamberg, the Emperor's First Commissioner at the Imperial Diet, continues at Passau, being indisposed; but as soon as his Health permits will proceed on his Journey thither, in order to be present in that Assembly. He is also appointed to receive the Homage of this City in the Name of his Imperial Majesty. Monsieur Troger, Deputy of Austria to the Diet, is lately arrived here; the Deputy of Mentz is shortly expected; and the Diet will in few days renew their Conferences, and take into Consideration several Matters that are to be laid before them by Order of the Emperor. The late Insurrection in the Upper Palatinate being entirely suppressed, every thing continues quiet in those Parts, where a sufficient Number of the Imperial Troops will be quartered this Winter, to keep the Malecontents in awe. We have an Account from Vienna, That the Earl of Sunderland and Mr. Stepney, Envoys Extraordinary and Plenipotentiaries from Her Majesty of Great Britain, together with the two Envoys and Plenipotentiaries from the States General, were gone from thence towards Tirnau, being to act as Mediators in the Treaty to be there set on foot for composing the Troubles in Hungary, in which Negotiation the Bishop of Onabrug and Count Wranslaw, with another Commissioner, are to transact Matters on the part of the Emperor; as Count Berzeni, Count Czaki, and Baron Zeniki, will do on the behalf of the Malecontents.

Cologne, Nov. 6. The Prince of Saxe-Zeitz, Bishop of Raab, is daily expected at Bonn, from whence his Highness will come thither, to receive the Homage of this City as Commissioner from the Emperor. It is said, That a Body of the Confederate Troops will shortly be drawn together upon the Moselle, to endeavour to repossest themselves of Triers, and will afterwards be quartered on that side during the Winter. Letters from the Upper Rhine say, That the necessary Dispositions were made for the Siege of Hombourg; after which the Imperial Army will separate, and march into Winter Quarters.

Breda, Nov. 7. N. S. A great Convoy of Provisions was sent from hence this morning to the Confederate Army, which is expected to-morrow at Moll and Balen. The Troops that are designed to quarter this Winter in this City, Bergenpzoom, Brilleduc, and other Towns on this side, left the Army two days ago near Hoegstraten, and two English Regiments of Horse, with as many Battalions of Foot, and the English Train of Artillery, marched into this place yesterday. The rest of the Troops that are to be in Garrison here being with the Forces that

that are sent as a Guard with the Dutch Train of Artillery to Boileduc, are not expected before next week. The Regiment of Woy is ordered from hence to Nimegen. The Enemy are likewise separating their Troops, 4 Brigades of Foot being marched from their Camp towards the Winter Quarters assigned them at Ghent, Bruges and Ostend, as the Troops of the French King's Household did the 5th Instant towards Mechlen and Brussels.

Falmouth, Nov. 3. The 31st past were put in here by contrary Winds the Sun and the Concord, two Dutch Doggers, belonging to Rotterdam, and homeward bound, being laden with Wine and Nuts from Bourdeaux. The same day came in the Four Brothers, Erasmus Muller Master, from Flushing; and the Lilly of the Valley, a Privateer belonging to that Port, which brought in as Prize the St. Peter of Havre-de-Grace: This Ship had been lately taken by a Guernsey Privateer, and retaken by the French. The William Privateer of Guernsey, Captain Brock Commander, came in also from cruising, having been out 16 days, and in that time taken and sent home 4 French Vessels laden with Salt. Yesterday came in here the Orange Galley, a Dutch Man of War of 44 Guns, and the Surinam, a Frigate of 24 Guns, belonging to the Dutch East-India Company: These two Ships are appointed to convoy home several Prizes that have lately been taken by Dutch Privateers, and brought into this Port. The Herbert Galley of London, commanded by Captain Wye, was chased into this Port the same day by some French Privateers. In the evening sailed hence to cruise two Guernsey Privateers, which took off of this Port that night an Ostend Caper of 6 Guns and 45 Men, and have sent her in here. This day the Prince of Friseland, a Dutch Privateer, came in from cruising, and brought in a retaken Dutch Ship, called the Greyhound of Rotterdam, homeward bound from Madera, which had lately been taken by a French Privateer. Two Dutch Doggers are also come in, being homeward bound with Butter and other Goods from Corke.

Plimouth, Nov. 4. This day came in here the Fortune of Rotterdam, homeward bound with Wine and Brandy from Bourdeaux, and the St. Peter of and for Middlebourg, laden with Rape-Seed from Lymerrick.

Yarmouth, Nov. 5. Yesterday arrived here several Vessels belonging to this Place from Rotterdam, but last from Harwich, whence they came in the Company of several other Merchant-men bound to the Northward, which passed by at the same time with their Convoys on the back of our Sands. This day sailed hence to the Southward the Leonora Galley of London, commanded by Captain Hedges, laden with Red Herrings.

The Dutch Mail of Friday last is not yet come in.

The Master, Wardens and Assistants, of Trinity-House, do give Notice, That the Sea-Mark some time since erected by them upon Apsly-Down in the Isle of Wight, which served as a Direction for Ships in their Passage into St Helens, to avoid running on Noman's-Land, is blown down: But that the same will be rebuilt as soon as possible.
