## The Trunk Road (High Street, Bethesda) (Restriction of Waiting) Order

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which will be that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the 1st day of May and the 30th day of September (both dates inclusive) in any year:

(b) if a period of less than 75 minutes has elapsed since the termination of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side of road.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in con-nection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance

of the road or the services therein.
