

(f) that the County Council of Lancaster and the Councils of the Urban Districts of Ashton-in-Makerfield, Billing and Winstanley, Haydock, Leyland, Newton-le-Willows and Orrell will become the highway authorities

for new roads and footpaths within their jurisdiction on 1st April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council concerned that the relevant new road or footpath is opened for the purposes of through traffic.
