Notice is hereby given that by an Order made on
Monday the 15th day of June 1959

Upon the Petition of the above named Pevensey
Bay Estates Limited (hereinafter called "the Com-
pany") on the 27th May 1959 preferred unto the
Court

And upon hearing Counsel for the Company and
for the Registrar of Companies (the Respondent)

And upon reading the said Petition the Affidavit of
Noel George Arnold and the Affidavit of Laurence
Stanley Monk both filed the 8th June 1959 and the

of the above mentioned Act (b) Particulars of the
Secretary of the said Company and a notification of
any change among the Directors and Secretary of the
said Company be sent to the Registrar of Companies
pursuant to Section 200 of the said Act and (c) a
notice of change of Registered Office of the said
Company be given pursuant to Section 107 of the said
Act

The Court ordered that the name of the above
named Pevensey Bay Estates Limited be restored to
the Register of Companies

And it was ordered that an Office Copy of this
Order be delivered to the Registrar of Companies And
pursuant to the above mentioned Act the said Peven-
sey Bay Estates Limited is thereupon to be deemed
to have continued in existence as if its name had not
been struck off

And it was ordered that a Meeting of the Company
be called pursuant to the provisions of Section 135
of the said Act for the purpose of passing the Resolu-
tion set forth in the Schedule hereto as a Special
Resolution and that the said Messrs Hicks Arnold &
Co. do convene such Meeting

And it was ordered that one Member of the Com-
pany present in person or by proxy do constitute a
quorum at such Meeting

And it was ordered that the Registrar of Companies
do advertise this Order (so far as it restores the name
of the Company to the said Register) in his official
name in the *London Gazette*

And it was ordered that the Petitioner the said
Pevensey Bay Estates Limited do pay to the Registrar
of Companies his costs of the said Petition such costs
to be taxed

Town and Country Planning Act, 1947

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation hereby

The Trunk Roads (Roads Restriction) (Fisherton Bridge, Salisbury) Order, 1959

On 22nd June 1959, the Minister of Transport and
Civil Aviation made the above-mentioned Order
under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, which
will come into operation on 13th July 1959.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit the driving of
any vehicle the weight of which, whether laden or
unladen, exceeds 12 tons on so much of the West
of Southampton—Salisbury—Bath Trunk Road
