"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment thereof will be provided: and (2) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Norton and Saint Michael and All Angels, Norton should be altered in the manner described in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the

"And whereas there is no consecrated church within the said area and the church of Saint Chad, Stockton on Tees therein has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and is intended to be

consecrated:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Maurice, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:
