2. Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

3. Copies of the Order (and of the map referred to therein) may be inspected free of charge at The Town Hall, Hayes, Middlesex, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 5th September 1959.

4. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The boundary of the area runs south along Lansbury Drive from its junction with Kingshill Avenue, then south west along Raynton Drive, then south east along Balmoral Drive, north east along the eastern curtilage of No. 200 Balmoral Drive and Nos. 97, 99 and 101 Gledwood Drive, then north west along the northern curtilage of No. 101 Gledwood Drive for approximately 56 yards, then in a north easterly direction to the eastern curtilages of No. 9 Pine Place, Lansbury Hall, and No. 4 Pine Place, north west along the canal feeder and the eastern curtilages of Nos. 168, 170, 172 Raynton Drive and No. 233 Kingshill Avenue, then west along Kingshill Avenue to its junction with Lansbury Drive.
