

"We the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Hugh, Bishop of Newcastle (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Chollerton and the benefice of Thockrington, both situate in the diocese of Newcastle.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Chollerton and the benefice of Thockrington shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Chollerton with Thockrington' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect and the Right Reverend John Hubert Dickinson if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Chollerton shall, with his consent (which has been given to us in writing), be the first incumbent of the united benefice

"3. *Patronage.* With the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the Right Reverend Hugh, Bishop of Newcastle, being the patron of the benefice of Thockrington, and with the consent (which has been given to us in writing) of Dorothy Hornby of The Riding, Hexham, in the County of Northumberland, Widow, being the patron of the benefice of Chollerton, the patronage of the said benefice of Thockrington shall be surrendered in favour of the said Dorothy Hornby, her heirs and assigns and the patronage of the united benefice of Chollerton with Thockrington shall belong wholly to and be exercisable by the said Dorothy Hornby, her heirs and assigns."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette*.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of August, 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton, in the diocese of Bradford.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment thereof will be provided:

"And whereas there is no consecrated church within the area and the church of Saint Martin, Heaton, therein has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and is intended to be consecrated:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Donald Bishop of Bradford (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal

seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:

"1. *Constitution:*

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes until the consecration of the church of Saint Martin, Heaton, therein situated.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of the said church the area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District. (or Parish) of Saint Martin, Heaton'.

"(2) *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery:*

The said district and parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Bradford and in the rural deanery of Bradford.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The Area comprising:

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton, which is bounded on the northwest by the parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Cottingley, on the southwest by the parish of Saint Peter, Allerton, on the southeast by the parish of Saint Philip, Gillington, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton, from the parish of Saint Philip, Gillington, in the middle of Heights Lane and extending thence generally northwards along the middle of Heights Lane to a point opposite to the western end of the southern boundary of the house and premises known as number 57 Heights Lane thence eastwards to and along the last-mentioned boundary and generally southwards, eastwards and northwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the southern and eastern sides of High Park Crescent to the eastern end of the northern boundary of the house and premises known as number 7 High Park Crescent thence westwards along the last mentioned boundary and in the same straight line to a point in the middle of High Park Crescent thence northwards along the middle of High Park Crescent, north eastwards along the middle of High Park Drive and northwestwards along the middle of Bingley Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton, from the parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Cottingley."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bradford.
