# STATE INTELLIGENCE

## PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 18th day of September 1959.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly pre-pared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of September 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Trusthorpe in the County and diocese of Lincoln.

#### " SCHEME

"Whereas we are satisfied that Mary Barlow Lomax, of 36 Lulworth Road, Southport in the County of Lancaster, Widow, is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice:

"And whereas the said Mary Barlow Lomax desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls :

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Kenneth, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being." being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

## The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly pre-pared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of September 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pur-suance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Kingsbury in the diocese of Birmingham.

### " SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied t endowment thereof will be provided: are satisfied that a suitable

"And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as the church of Saint Paul, Dosthill, which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parisin church of the new parish and of which the patron-age belongs to the Bishop of Birmingham by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 17th day of June 1959, and made pursuant to section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943: "Now, therefore, with the concept of the Picht

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard, Bishop of Birmingham (in testi-mony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:

#### "1. Constitution

"(a) As from the day of the date of the publica-tion in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a new parish.

"(b) The Church of Saint Paul, Dosthill aforesaid, shall be the parish church of the parish. "(c) The name of the parish shall be 'The Parish of Dosthill and Wood End'.
