### LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930

Lincolnshire River Board (Witham Area) Scheme 1959. The Lincolnshire River Board (hereinafter called "the River Board ") in pursuance of section 8 of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, as applied by the River Boards Act, 1948, submit to the Minister of Agriculture Fisheries and Food (hereinafter called "the Minister") for confirmation under the said Act the following

1. For varying the provisions of all Awards in so far as such provisions affect the powers or duties with respect to land drainage of drainage authorities of which the River Board are the successors in the drainage districts more particularly set out in the First Schedule hereto

Such incidental consequential or supplemental provisions as are necessary or proper for the pur-

poses of the scheme

#### SCHEME

1. This scheme may be cited as the Lincolnshire iver Board (Witham Area) Scheme 1959.
2. This scheme shall came into operation on the

day to be appointed by the Minister (hereinafter called "the appointed day").

3. As and from the appointed day the provisions of all Awards affecting or relating to land drainage within the drainage districts set out in the First Schedule here on surface to have effect so far as they enter the contract of the contra they relate to any watercourse shown as main river on the map approved for that purpose by the Minister under section 6 of the River Boards Act, 1948, on the 17th day of January 1951, as amended 10th day of November 1953, and situate within the said drainage districts or any of them or to any drainage works in

connection with such a watercourse.

4. The variation of the provisions of the Awards hereinbefore referred to or of any of them shall not determine any agreements under which the drainage authorities referred to in the said Awards or any of them were relieved of the exercise of any functions

or liabilities contained in the said Awards and in particular the agreements or any of them referred to in the Second Schedule hereto shall notwithstanding the other provisions of this scheme remain in full force and effect.
