*Venise, December 19. N. S.*

**T**HE Imperial Army Comanded by Prince Eugene continues encamped near Lonato. The French Army under the Duke of Vendosme is also still in the same Camp, not far from the Imperialists: He has lately sent a Detachment to take Post at Dezenzano. Another Detachment of his Troops is posted along the Mela; and a third has passed the Mincio near Borghetto, and seems to design the laying of a Bridge there over that River.

*Viena, December 19.* The Council of War has received Letters from the Governor of Arath, with Advice, That on the 14th Instant 12 Hussars arrived there, who give an Account of a second Action in Transylvania, not far from Samos-Yvar, where Field-Marshal Herbeville had defeated a great number of the Malecontents, and made himself Master of that important Fortress, and of a very considerable Train of Artillery: They add, that he was marching from thence in pursuit of the Enemy towards Bisfritz. Count Schlick was not present at this second Action, having been sent to confer with Field-Marshal Rabutin, who came out to meet him 3 Leagues from Hermanstad; with a Detachment of 1000 Foot and 300 Horse, with which he was marching towards Mullebach, in order to retake Deva: And Count Schlick was returning with 3 Regiments of Horse and a Body of Rascians through the Territory of Kalmath towards Gena. They write from Presbourg of the 14th, That Count Berzeni was said to have passed that day through Sommerein, in the Island of Schut, going towards Oedenbourg, with intent, as was thought, to besiege that Place with a Body of Malecontents. Baron Szirmai went from hence this morning towards Hungary. There are Hopes that the Peasants in Bavaria will submit, and, through the Intercession of the Archbishop of Saltzbourg, will obtain of the Emperor an Amnesty for the Disorders already committed. To morrow *Te Deum* will be sung in the Cathedral of St. Stephen, and there will be great Rejoycings, for his Catholick Majesty's late Glorious Successes in Catalonia.

*Ratisbon, December 24.* The Malecontents in Bavaria took lately by Surprise a little Town called Landau, on the River Her; and having left but a small number of their Men there, marched to attack Dingelshingen; but the Governor of that Place having Notice of it, marched out against them with all the Horse in his Garison, and soon put them to flight. They then returned to Landau; but the Inhabitants, who in the meant time had turned out their new Garison, shut the Gates upon them, and

flood to their Arms; and the Malecontents did not think fit to attack them. Kelhaim has also been retaken from them by a Body of Imperial Troops, which is since marched to Ingolstad; a sufficient Garison having been drawn out of it to be left at Kelhaim, and a Reinforcement to be sent to Straubingen. More Imperial Forces are marching towards Bavaria; and we have great reason to hope that a short end will be put to that Insurrection.

*Francfort, December 27.* Two Regiments of the Elector Palatine's Forces are marching into Bavaria, besides 3 of the Duke of Wirtemberg's Troops and two of those of the Circle of Franconia; so that there will shortly be a considerable Body of Troops in that Electorate, ready to reduce the Malecontents there, if they do not prevent it by laying down their Arms. It is said the Duke of Wirtemberg is to command the Forces that are to be employed in this Service. The Garison of Landau in Alface has lately been reinforced with a Regiment of Foot.

*Hague, January 1. N. S.* The Convoy which is to attend the Duke of Marlborough in his Passage to England came before the Goree the 28th past, and is since come into Helvoet-Sluis. His Grace intends to embark with the next Opportunity of Wind and Weather. The States General have appointed Monsieur Buys, one of the Two Pensionaries of Amsterdam, to be their Envoy Extraordinary to Her Majesty of Great Britain; and he intends to take the Opportunity of his Grace's Convoy to go over thither. Letters from Madrid say, the Duke of Anjou's Departure from thence towards Catalonia was put off a second time, and that it would not be before February next; there being still a want at that Court of several things which are necessary for his going upon such an Expedition.

*Falmouth, December 22.* The 14th Instant arrived here the Margaret Gailey, Joseph Emmons Master, one of the homeward-bound Jamaica Fleet, laden with Sugar and Ginger: She came last from Boston, whence she

the *Sail* the 12th past, in Company of several other Merchant-men, under Convoy of Her Majesty's Ship the *Guernsey*, but was separated from them the 24th in bad Weather. Yesterday failed hence to cruise the *Marlborough*, a Privateer of *Flushing*. This day came in here the *Lark Galley* of this Place, John Richards Master, laden with Wine from the *Canaries*, but lost from *St. Hubs*; and the *Prince Packet-Boat* from *Plimouth*.

*Plimouth, December 21.* Yesterday came in the Adventure of and from *Boston*, and the *Providence* of *Topsham* from *Boston*: They were separated about 14 days ago in bad Weather from 8 *Sail* more, under Convoy of Her Majesty's Ship the *Guernsey*.

*Dartmouth, December 21.* Last night arrived here the *Langdon Frigate* of this Place, Captain Arthur Holfsworth Commander, who was separated from the homeward-bound *Newfoundland Fleet* in bad Weather, in a terrible Storm, had all his Masts carried by the board, his Guns dismounted, his Anchors washed from the Bow, his Quarter broke in, and by a miraculous Providence was preserved from being founder'd: She has a great number of Passengers on board.

*Bristol, December 24.* Yesterday failed out of *King-road* Her Majesty's Ship the *Speedwell*, with a Fleet of Merchant-men under her Convoy, some bound to *Ireland*, and the rest to other Parts. This day failed hence Her Majesty's Ship the *Lizard*, with three Store-ships and as many Merchant-men under her Convoy, bound for *Plimouth*.

*Tarmouth, December 24.* Several Merchant-men belonging to the *Hamburgh* and *Eastland Fleets*, under Convoy of Her Majesty's Ships the *Romney* and *Bona-adventure*, that were lately put back hither by contrary Winds, failed yesterday out of our Road to the Southward.

*Portsmouth, December 25.* On Sunday last in the afternoon arrived at *Spithead* Her Majesty's Ships the *Hazardous* and *Moderate*, with about 50 *Sail* of Ships under their Convoy from the *Downes*.

His Royal Highness Prince George of Denmark, Lord High Admiral of England, &c. is pleased to direct, That the Men which did belong to Her Majesty's late Ship the *Pendennis*, do, as soon as they arrive in England, repair on board the Royal *Catherine* at *Chatham*, to serve in her; on board of which Ship his Royal Highness has ordered their Wages to be paid them before she sails from the *Buoy* of the *Nore*.

Her Majesty's Ships the *Somerser*, *Royal Oak*, *Russell*, *Firme*, *Resolution*, *Ipswich*, and *Northumberland*, being ordered to proceed forthwith to Sea; These are therefore to give notice, That 'tis the Commands of his Royal Highness Prince George of Denmark, &c. Lord High Admiral of England, &c. That such of the Men belonging to the aforesaid Ships as are now in *Town*, or otherwise absent from them, do immediately repair to their said Ships at *Portsmouth*, where they will be paid to the first of July last past, before they sail from *Spithead*.

It being resolved, That 100 *Seamen* more, such as have been disabled in the Service of the *Navy*, shall be forthwith received and provided for in Her Majesty's Royal Hospital at *Greenwich*; His Royal Highness, Lord High Admiral of England, has commanded this Notice to be given thereof, that so all such Persons, whose Conditions entitle them to the Benefit of the aforesaid Hospital, may attend at the *Admiralty-Office*, on Friday the 28th of this Month.

If any Able-bodied Men are willing to serve Her Majesty in the *Train of Artillery* abroad, let them repair to Captain *Silver*, Master-Gunner of England, at his House in *St. James's-Park*, they shall enter into present Pay of Seven *Shillings* a Week, and be further encouraged and advanced as they shall deserve.
