HE Imperial Army Commanded by Prince Eugene continues encamped near Lonato. The French Army under the Duke of Vendosme is also still in the same Comp, not far from the Imperialists: He has lately fent a Detachment to take Post at Dezenzano. Another Detachment of his Troops is posted along the Mela; and a third has passed the Mincio near Borghetto, and seems to design the laying of a Bridge

there over that River. The Council of War has re-Vienta, December 19. teived Letters from the Governor of Arath, with Advice, That on the 14th Instant 12 Hussars arrived there, who give an Account of a second Action in Transilvanis, not far from Samos-Yvar, where Field-Marshal Herbeille had defeated a great number of the Male-contents, and made himself Master of that important Fortress, and of a very considerable Train of Artillery: They add, that he was marching from thence in purhit of the Enemy towards Bistritz. Count Schlick was not present at this second Action, having been sent to tonfer with Field-Maeshal Rabutin, who came out to methim 3 Leagues from Hermanstad; with a Detachmethim 3 Leagues from Hermanitad, with a Detachment of 1000 Foor and 300 Horfe, with which he was barching towards Mullebach, in order to retake Deva: Am Count Schlick was returning with 3 Regiments of Horfe and a Body of Rascians through the Territory of Kilmath towards Gena. They write from Presburg of the 14th, That Count Berzeni was said to have passed that day through Sommarein, in the Island and Schur going sowards Oedenbourg, with intent as of Schut, going towards Oedenbourg, with intent, as of schut, going towards Oedenbourg, with intent, as was thought, to beliege that Place with a Body of Malecontents. Baron Szirmai went from hence this moming towards Hungary. Ratisbon, December 24. The Malecontens in Bavaria took lately by Surprise a little Town called Landau, on the River ler; and having left but a small number of their Men there, marched to attack Dingelfingen; but the Governor of that Place having Notice of it, marched out against them with all the Horse in his Garison, and loon put them to flight. They then returred to Landau; but the Inhabitants, who in the mean time had turned out their new Garison, shut the Gates upon them, and

stood to their Arms; and the Malecontents did not think fit to attack them. Kellidim has also been retaken from them by a Body of Imperial Troops, which is fince marched to Ingolftad; a sufficient Garison having been drawn out of it to be left at Kelhaim, and a Reinforcement to be fent to Straubin-More Imperial Forces are marching towards Bavaria; and we have great reason to hope that a short end will be put to that Infurrection.

Two Regiments Francfort, December 27. of the Elector Palatine's Forces are marching into Bavaria, besides 3 of the Duke of Wirtemberg's Troops and two of those of the Circle of Franconia; so that there will shotrly be a considerable Body of Troops in that Electorate, ready to reduce the Malecontents there, if they do not prevent it by laying down their Arms. It is faid the Duke of Wirteniberg is to command the Forces that are to be employed in this Service. The Garison of Landau in Alsace has late-

ly been reinforced with a Regiment of Foot.

Hague, January 1. N. S. The Convoy
which is to attend the Duke of Marlborough in his Passage to England came before the Goree the 28th past, and is since come into Helvoet-Sluis. His Grace intends to embark with the next Opportunity of Wind and Weather. The States General have appointed Monsieur Buys, one of the Two Pensionaries of Amsterdam, to be their Envoy Extraordinary to Her Majesty of Great Britain; and he intends to take the Opportunity of his Grace's Convoy to go over thither. Letters from Madrid fay, the Duke of Anjou's Departure from thence towards Catalonia was put off a fecond time, and that it would not be before February next; there being still a want at that Court of feveral things which are necessary for his going upon such an Expedition.
