

by that part of the parish of Hound hereinbefore annexed to the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hedge End, on the east by the parish of Bursledon and on the remaining sides by a continuous imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the last mentioned parish from the parish of Hound at a point opposite the eastern end of the northern boundary of close numbered 279 (or Mallard's Moor) and continuing thence westwards to and along the aforesaid boundary and generally southwards and then westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of close numbered 104 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of Hamble Lane and continuing thence north-eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite the southern boundary of close numbered 105 and continuing thence north-westwards and north-eastwards along the southern and western boundaries of the last mentioned close to a point opposite the middle of the footpath running along the southwestern boundary of close numbered 106 and continuing thence along the last mentioned footpath to a point opposite the southern end of the northwestern boundary of close numbered 106 and continuing thence north-eastwards to a point opposite to the eastern end of the southern boundary of close numbered 108 and continuing thence generally westwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and along the northwestern corner of close numbered 107 to the northeastern boundary of close numbered 109A and continuing thence along the last mentioned boundary and along the footpath which runs in the same direction across close numbered 109 to Grange Lane and in a straight line in continuation thereof to and then north-eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to the boundary of that part of the parish of Hound hereinbefore annexed to the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hedge End."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of November 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of St. John, Upperby, and Scotby in the diocese of Carlisle.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment thereof will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Carlisle, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme) we, the said Church Commis-

sioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution*

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of St. Elisabeth, Harraby'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery*

"The district (or parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Carlisle and in the rural deanery of Carlisle.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The area comprising:

"All those contiguous parts (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Saint John, Upperby, and Scotby which taken together are bounded on part of the north by the parish of Saint Aidan, Carlisle, on the northwest by the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Carlisle, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Carlisle, from the parish of Saint John, Upperby, in the middle of London Road and proceeding thence south-eastwards along the middle of London Road to a point on the Carlisle County Borough boundary thence first generally north-eastwards then westwards along the last mentioned boundary to a point at the northwestern corner of close No. 29 (on the map) on the boundary which divides the parish of Scotby from the parish of Saint John, Upperby, thence north-westwards along the last mentioned boundary to the point where the boundaries of the parishes of Scotby, Saint John, Upperby, and Saint Aidan, Carlisle, all meet."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of November 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of London, (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme) for authorising the sale of the site of the former parish church of Saint George, Hornsey, in the diocese of London.

"SCHEME

"Whereas (i) the former parish church of Saint George, Hornsey had been severely damaged by enemy action and the remains, which became a dangerous structure, have since been entirely taken down under the authority of a Faculty granted out of the Consistorial Court of the diocese of London on the 23rd November 1955, (ii) a new church has been erected upon another site within the same parish and has been duly consecrated:
