

## NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949

### WARE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

#### *Ware Rural District Council Footpath Spellers Hunsdon Diversion Order, 1959*

Notice is hereby given that on the 15th day of December 1959, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from Road C.15 at the entrance to the Builder's Yard at Spellers, Acorn Street, through the Builder's Yard to a point opposite Chestnut Lodge on the Road B.180 to a line running from Road C.15 approximately 227 feet north of the entrance to the Builder's Yard at Spellers in a westerly direction to a point approximately 350 feet north-east of the entrance to Chestnut Lodge on the Road B.180. The public right of way to be extinguished will be closed from the 13th January 1960.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council's Offices, 97 New Road, Ware, Herts, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays and 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 24th day of December 1959, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds, that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

## BOROUGH OF SWINDON

### *Borough of Swindon (Walcot Pond Footpath) Diversion Order, 1959*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 23rd day of December 1959, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the parishes of Stratton St. Margaret and Swindon.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way running from a point near the Engine House of the Marshgate Bone Works, Stratton Road, Swindon in north-easterly and south-easterly directions through neighbouring fields and crossing the aqueduct which was formerly part of the Wilts and Berks Canal works, to the bridle path which runs in a north-westerly direction towards Stratton St. Margaret (a length of about 1,170 feet) to a line running from the same point near the Bone Works, through land of the Swindon Corporation a short distance to the south-west of the present footpath, and crossing a footbridge over Walcot Pond, to the same bridlepath about fifty feet south-east of its junction with the present footpath (a length of about 1,100 feet).

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the office of the Town Clerk, Civic Offices, Euclid Street, Swindon, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (12 noon on Saturdays).

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, (Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1), before the 30th day of January 1960, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.
