

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 8th day of February 1960.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 21st day of January 1960, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Purton in the County of Wilts and in the diocese of Bristol.

"SCHEME

"Whereas (1) we are satisfied that the Right Honourable Anthony, Earl of Shaftesbury, K.P., G.C.V.O., C.B.E. (hereinafter called 'the said Earl of Shaftesbury') is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice;

"(2) the said Earl of Shaftesbury desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Bristol for the time being and consents to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same);

"(3) we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls;

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Oliver, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Oliver, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Bristol for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bristol.

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of January 1960, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Archdeaconries and Rural Deaneries Act, 1874, and of the Acts mentioned therein, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed and sealed the same), with respect to the rural deaneries of King's Cliffe, Uppingham, Barnack, Oundle and Peterborough, within the Archdeaconry of Oakham, and in the diocese of Peterborough.

"SCHEME

"As from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall have been published in the *London Gazette* and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order:

"1. The rural deanery of King's Cliffe shall cease to exist and the parishes formerly comprising the said rural deanery shall be transferred to the rural

deaneries of Uppingham, Oundle and Barnack as specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto.

"2. There shall be transferred to the rural deanery of Peterborough those parishes now in the rural deanery of Barnack which are specified in Part II of the Schedule hereto.

"SCHEDULE

"Parishes comprising the rural deanery of King's Cliffe to be transferred:

"(a) to the rural deanery of Uppingham:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Peterborough.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Michael, Archbishop of York (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Birkin and the benefice of Haddlesey, both situate in the diocese of York.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Birkin and the benefice of Haddlesey shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Birkin and Haddlesey', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect.
