URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF CHESHUNT *The Cheshunt (Theobalds Lane) Footpath Diversion Order, 1959*

On the 6th day of January 1960, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

Its effect of the Order is to divert the public right-of-way running over certain land being parcel No. 1534 in the Ordnance Survey Sheet No. XLI.12 Hertfordshire (Revision of 1935) in a north-westerly direction from a point in Theobalds Lane, so that it runs in a westerly direction from that point for a distance of approximately 760 feet to the bridge over the New River, to meet the public right-of-way on the eastern side of the said New River.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Turners Hill, Cheshunt, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday, and 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday.

The Order becomes operative as from the 22nd day of February 1960, and if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

BASILDON URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Basildon Urban District Council (Wickford Memorial Park) Footpath Diversion Order, 1960

The above Order made on the 16th day of February 1960 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way running from Point "A" situated on the north bank of the River Crouch adjacent to the footbridge 159 yards from Runwell Road in a southerly direction for 179 yards to Point "C", thence in an easterly direction for 80 yards to Point "C1" and thence in a southerly direction for 64 yards to Point "F". From Point "D" situated 117 yards south of Point "A" described above, in an easterly direction for 473 yards to Point "E" at its junction with the northern extremity of Highcliffe Road, to a line running from Point "A" in a southerly direction along the western bank of the River Crouch to Point "B" situated 20 yards east of the entrance to Wickford Memorial Park in Runwell Road, thence in an easterly direction for 186 yards to Point "C1" thence in a

southerly direction for 64 yards to Point "F", thence in an easterly direction for 186 yards to Point "G", thence in a northerly direction for 47 yards to Point "H", thence in an easterly direction for 190 yards to Point "J" and thence in a north-easterly direction for 50 yards to Point "E".

A certified copy of the Order and the Map contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, 98 High Street, Billericay, and will be open for inspection free of charge at all reasonable times.

THE LONDON GOVERNMENT ACT, 1939

METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF SAINT PANCRAS

Bye-law for Good Rule and Government under section 146 of The London Government Act, 1939—Noisy Hawking.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Saint Pancras has made a bye-law, in pursuance of the powers contained in section 146 of the London Government Act 1939, prohibiting persons when hawking, selling, distributing or advertising any articles, from shouting, using a bell or other noisy instrument in any street or public place so as to cause annoyance to the inhabitants of the neighbourhood.
