### TREASURY

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 9 and 13 of, and the Fifth Schedule to, the Import Duties Act, 1958, and by paragraph 2 of the Sixth Schedule to that Act, viz.:

The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 3) Order, 1960.

This Order reduces the rates of drawback of import duty on:

- (a) certain square sawn wood and timber and wooden veneer sheets used in making exported sewing machine woodwork of specified types, and
- (b) imported linseed oil used in the manufacture of certain exported goods.

The new and previous rates are set out in the Schedule to the Order.

The Order comes into operation on 1st March, 1960, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1960, No. 281.
