The Trunk Road (Various Streets, Milford Haven) (Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1960

On 12th February 1960, the Minister of Transport made the above-mentioned Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, which will come into operation on 1st March 1960.

The effect of the Order is that with certain exceptions, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait:

- (a) in any of the parts of a road or the length of road specified in the First Schedule hereto; or
- (b) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in any of the parts of a road specified in the Second Schedule hereto:
 - (i) for a longer period than two hours; or
 - (ii) if a period of less than two hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicles in that part of road.
