East Ashford Rural District Council Extinguishment Order No. 2. Parishes of Aldington and Smeeth

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 1st day of December 1959, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the following parishes of Aldington and Smeeth.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish the public rights of way from (i) a point on the south side of the A20 Ashford/Folkestone road just to the west of Water Farm, Smeeth, whence it travels in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately eight hundred and seventy yards to a point at the western end of Ordnance Survey plot No. 297 Aldington, Kent (Sheet LXXIII-4, 1907 Edition, crosses the railway track and continues in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately nine hundred and thirty yards to a point just north of the southern boundary of Ordnance Survey plot No. 317 Kent Sheet LXXIII-8 1907 Edition, and approximately two hundred and thirty yards north-east of Hogben Farm, Church Lane, Aldington; (ii) a point on footpath (i) above at the north eastern corner of Ordnance Survey plot No. 267 Kent Sheet LXXIII-4, it travels in a south-westerly direction for a distance of four hundred and seventy yards and thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of Park Wood to a point approximately two hundred yards east of Smeeth station; (iii) a point on footpath (ii) near to the western boundary of Ordnance Survey plot No. 267 Kent Sheet LXXIII-4, it travels in a south-westerly direction, crosses the railway line, and continues in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately two hundred and sixty yards to a point on the north-western corner of Ordnance Survey No. 290, Aldington, Kent Sheet LXXIII-4 where the Aldington/Smeeth parish boundary ceases to run down the centre of the River Stour and deviates in a southerly direction to Backhouse Wood, Aldington.
