Exceptions are made in the Order to allow vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary in connection with-

- (a) persons boarding or alighting from a vehicle,
- (b) the loading or unloading of goods,
- (c) building operations, funerals, removal of obstructions to traffic, maintenance of the length of road, sewers or mains, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraph line.

Vary the provisions of Article 4 of The Borough of Mansfield (Traffic Regulation) Order, 1949, and Article 2 of The Borough of Mansfield (Traffic Regulation) Order, 1954, relating to the undermentioned roads to include in the exceptions from provisions of such Orders the waiting by vehicle in connection with a funeral-

) prohibit the driving of vehicles on any of the lengths of road specified in the first column hereunder otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to such length in the second column:

(c) Whitehall, from the junction with Church Lane to 122 yards south-west of the junction with Princess Avenue.

There will be the usual exemptions in the Order as regards (a) and (b) above to permit vehicles to wait for the purposes of enabling persons to board or alight, goods to be loaded or unloaded, vehicles to take in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage and to enable works to be carried out in the lengths of road.
