

The Trunk Road (Various Streets, Accrington) (Restriction of Waiting) Order

The Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which will be that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.:

- (a) in either of the lengths or the side of the Leeds-Halifax-Burnley-Blackburn-East of Preston Trunk Road (A.679) in the Borough of Accrington specified in the First Schedule hereto; or
- (b) in either of the lengths of the said Trunk Road specified in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto:
 - (i) on the side of the road specified opposite that length of road in the second column of the said second schedule on even dates; or
 - (ii) on the side of the road specified opposite that length of road in the third column of the said second schedule on odd dates; or
 - (iii) on the side of road on which vehicles are not for the time being prohibited from waiting by (i) or (ii) above:
 - (a) for a longer period than 30 minutes; or
 - (b) if a period of less than 30 minutes has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

Objections to the Order must be sent to the Secretary, Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London W.1, by the 26th day of April 1960 quoting ref. RTC 26/66/05.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Lengths and side of the Leeds-Halifax-Burnley-Blackburn-East of Preston Trunk Road in the Borough of Accrington.

1. Blackburn Road, between its junction with Fox Street and Ellison Street and its junction with Eagle Street and Edgar Street.
2. Broadway, south-east side between its junction with Blackburn Road and its junction with Whalley Road.
3. Burnley Road between its junction with Whalley Road and its junction with Melbourne Street and Moore Street.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has now confirmed the Order made on the 21st December 1959, confirming the Scheme submitted by the Great Ouse River Board under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, as applied by the River Boards Act, 1948, making provision for the following matters:

- (i) The constitution of the Buckingham Internal Drainage District and of the Drainage Board thereof;
- (ii) Matters supplemental thereto or consequential thereon.

The Scheme affects lands in the following areas:

In the County of Buckingham

The Municipal Borough of Buckingham; the Urban Districts of Wolverton and Newport Pagnell; and the Parishes of Addington, Adstock, Barton Hartshorn, Beachampton, Bradwell, Bradwell Abbey, Buckingham, Castlethorpe, Chetwode, Drayton Parslow, Dunton, East Claydon, Foxcote, Gayhurst, Granborough, Great Horwood, Great Linford, Haversham-cum-Little Linford, Hillesden, Hoggeston, Hogshaw, Lathbury, Little Horwood, Leckhampstead, Loughton, Maids Moreton, Middle Claydon, Mursley, Nash, Newport Pagnell, North Marston, Oving, Padbury, Preston Bissett, Quainton, Stantonbury, Shenley Brook End, Shenley Church End, Steeple Claydon, Stewkley, Swanbourne, Thornborough, Thornton, Twyford, Whaddon, Winslow and Wolverton.

In the County of Oxford

The Parishes of Fringford, Godington, Hardwick with Tusmere, Hethe, Newton Purcell with Shelswell, Stoke Lyne and Stratton Audley.

In the County of Northampton

The Parishes of Cosgrove, Deanshanger, Old Stratford, Potterspury and Wicken.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the Land Drainage Act, 1930, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act, or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.
