1. The public right of way over the land situate in the Parish of Herrington shown coloured brown on the Map annexed hereto and described in the Schedule hereto shall be extinguished at the expiration of ten days from the date of confirmation of this Order.
2. This Order may be cited as the Sunderland Rural District, Parish of Herrington, Public Footpath No. 11, Extinguishment Order, 1960.
