

"2. Officers who have already qualified under former regulations as 2nd Class Interpreters or 1st Class Interpreters, to be eligible, on the first occasion of re-qualifying under these revised conditions, for a special award equal to the difference between the appropriate award specified in Clause 1, above, and any sum already paid on first qualifying in that language, such award being made instead of that mentioned in Clauses 3 and 4, below.

"3. Except as stated in Clause 2, above, one-third of the appropriate award specified in Clause 1, above, to be payable to officers who, on re-qualifying in any particular language, maintain their highest previous grade in that language.

"4. Except as stated in Clause 2, above, officers who, on re-qualifying as Linguist or 2nd Class Interpreter in any particular language, also qualify for advancement to a higher grade in that language, to be eligible for an award equal to the difference between the appropriate amounts stated in Clause 1, above; such award being made in addition to that mentioned in Clause 3, above.

"5. No award to be paid to officers who fail to maintain their highest previous grade in that language."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 24th June 1960, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £290,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 27th June 1960, to Saturday, the 2nd July 1960, inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by

means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
