Made - - - - 3rd August 1960

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 3rd day of August 1960.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Broughton, in the County of Oxfordshire, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the eleventh day of May, 1960, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. No new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Broughton save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:

Broughton—Forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of St. Mary's Church, in the said Parish.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Broughton) Order, 1960.

The Burial Grounds (Sharlston) Order, 1960

Made - - - - 3rd August 1960

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 3rd day of August 1960.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Sharlston, in the County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the eleventh day of May 1960, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. No new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Sharlston save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:

Sharlston.—Forthwith and entirely in Sharlston churchyard in the said Parish.

Provided that—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Sharlston) Order, 1960.
