Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Com-

Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of July 1960 (N.P. 2632/60) in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such a manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated 21st March 1924, 24th February 1948, 29th September 1949, 30th June 1955, 16th May 1956, and 19th

December 1956, sanction was given, inter alia, to certain scales of gratuities for long service, or on invaliding for non-attributable causes, to Locally Entered Petty Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Naval Forces:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that in so far as they affect Goan, Somali, West African, St. Helenian and Bantu Petty Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Naval Forces, revised scales and conditions for the award of gratuities should be introduced:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from 1st September 1959, the revised arrangements set out in the annexed Schedule:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal:

"SCHEDULE

The provisions of this Schedule apply to all Goan, Somali, West African, St. Helenian and Bantu Locally Entered ratings who are discharged from the Naval Service after the 31st August, 1959, (cease pay date).

"SECTION I

"2. A rating discharged otherwise than for mis-conduct, or for inefficiency due to causes within his own control, and who has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service may be awarded a gratuity con-sisting of the sum of elements for service and rank assessed as follows:
